### **MEETING MINUTES**

#### 1. Call to Order & Introduction of Members

The meeting began at 6:08 P.M. by Commissioner Brown and the new Commissioner Springer was introduced and welcomed by the commissioners.

Commissioner Springer expressed gratitude for the warmth welcome she had received from the commissioners and staff. She said that she was very happy and excited to be part of the Sacramento Disabilities Advisory Commission (DAC). Ms. Springer indicated that she was looking forward to contributing via her talent, experience and passion in advancing the inclusion and the participation of people with disabilities in the mainstream of what we do and a better city for every one else.

#### 4. Approval of Minutes

## 5. Accessible Pedestrian Signals (APS) Product Review

Rocky Burks, Department of Transportation (DOT) reported on the proposed Accessible Pedestrian Signals Standards and Specifications DOT will be implementing. Mr. Burks explained that currently, audible signals are installed upon request along a specific route of travel and generally are only installed at intersections that have pedestrian actuation.

Staff indicated that the preferred APS meets all pertinent accessibility requirements, including the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) standards for all traffic control. Additionally, the Revised Draft Guidelines for Accessible Public Rights of Way (2005) include accessibility features for APS that mimic those for the MUTCD.

Mr. Burks reported that DOT has reviewed all appropriate APS requirements and has developed the City of Sacramento's APS Standards and Specifications.

Staff said by this presentation to DAC, DOT hopes this would be a good avenue to educate and inform members and the community of DOT's committed efforts to achieve improved accessibility compliance in the Public Right's of Way.

Staff requested acknowledgment and support from the DAC on the future APS implementation.

Commissioner Thom moved to endorsed the APS product standards and specifications as presented. Seconded by Commissioner Benson. Motion Passed.

#### 6. Staff Update

Staff updated the Commissioners on the DAC recruitment efforts and encouraged them to seek out individuals who may have interest on serving on the DAC. Ideas for August DAC agenda items were exchanged.

#### 7. Comments / Announcements

Commissioners agreed to take a July recess. The next full DAC meeting is Thursday, August 16, 2007 at 6:00 P.M.

#### 8. Adjournment
