




**Overall Sentiment**





The federal actions we are seeing across the nation are threatening immigrant communities and creating fear and uncertainty for all of our residents. Immediate action from the City is needed to protect the Constitutional rights of the people who live and work here.

I strongly urge this Committee to support an ordinance directing the City Manager to adopt a Citywide Policy that prohibits the use of any City facilities or City property for immigration-related enforcement activities. This includes prohibiting their use as staging areas, as processing locations, or operational bases.

The ordinance should also:

Identify all relevant City properties and facilities—both interior and exterior areas.

Require the design and posting of clear signage stating that civil immigration enforcement activities are prohibited on these properties and facilities.

Advise private landowners and leaseholders to identify non\_public areas where civil immigration enforcement is not allowed, and provide free signage to support them.
