and

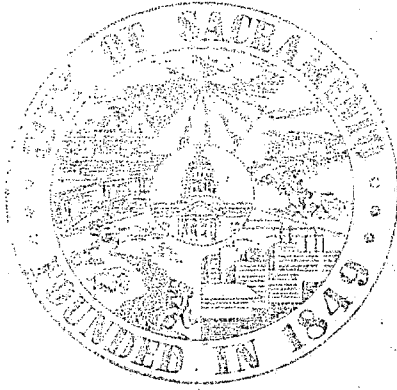
