**SUBJECT:** Grant Application: Career Criminal Apprehension Program, State-of-the-Art Proposal - Major Crime Pattern and Series Response Program

SUMMARY

This report concerns:

1. Approval of a grant application to the California Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) for a Career Criminal Apprehension Program, State-of-the-Art Grant. This grant will provide funds for a Major Crime Pattern and Series Response Project.
2. The authorization for the City Manager to execute an agreement with OCJP for the implementation of the aforementioned State-of-the-Art grant.
3. The authorization of the City Manager to utilize \$25,000 from the current Police Department budget for the purpose of implementing this State-of-the-Art grant.

BACKGROUND

A major portion of the serious crime problem existing in the City of Sacramento can be attributed to a relatively small number of multiple and repeat felony offenders often referred to as "career criminals." This problem is common in all urban areas in the State and ultimately resulted in the passage of the Career Criminal Apprehension Program (C-CAP) by the California State Legislature. The three major components of the C-CAP are in the areas of:

1. Crime Analysis
2. Managing Patrol Operations
3. Managing Criminal Investigations

## BACKGROUND (cont.)

In 1982, the Police Department applied for and received a grant for the Crime Analysis Module. In 1983, the Police Department did not participate in the program for the Managing Patrol Operations Module since this portion of the C-CAP Program had already been implemented with a Federal grant. However, consultation was provided to other California cities implementing Crime Analysis and M.P.O. by amending and extending the Police Department's first year grant award for the Crime Analysis Module.

More recently, we applied for and anticipate receipt of a grant for the third C-CAP Module, "Managing Criminal Investigations (MCI)." This module will provide an improved data processing system for the management of criminal investigations, promote active communication between M.P.O. and Crime Analysis, and enhance the role of the uniformed officer in the investigation of crimes committed by career criminals.

Use of these C-CAP modules has permitted the Police Department to slow and, in some instances, reduce the overall level of career criminal activities in the City of Sacramento. This has been accomplished by obtaining a maximum level of service from available police resources. One of the major side effects of stretching these resources to their limits is that we have been unable to adequately schedule officers for assignment on an as-needed basis for apprehension and suppression activities in response to major crime patterns and series.

Since no major increase in sworn personnel is presently anticipated, new means need to be developed to improve the State-of-the-Art in the Managing Patrol Operations phase of C-CAP. What this grant will research and develop is a program which involves the proactive use of portable alarms as a means of response on major crime patterns and series. The use of these alarms would be designed to decrease response time and free officers currently restricted to limited geographic areas monitoring receivers.

FINANCIAL DATA

The total cost of this budget is \$125,000. The Office of Criminal Justice Planning grant funds will provide 80%, or \$100,000. The remaining 20%, or \$25,000, will be taken from the Police Department's existing budget and utilized as the City's matching contribution.

These grant funds will be used for the support of a C-CAP State-of-the-Art grant project to improve the responsiveness of the Police Department to major crime patterns and series which involve career criminals.

More specifically, funds will be spent on the following support services and equipment:


- . Alarm and surveillance equipment and related maintenance agreements.
- . Systems design consultant services.
- . Part-time use of a police officer to install, monitor the use of, and keep statistical records for the results of the specialized equipment utilized.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is my recommendation that the City Council approve:


1. The "Career Criminal Apprehension Application Program: State-of-the-Art Grant for Major Crime Patterns and Series Response Project," and authorize the City Manager to execute an agreement with OCJP for the implementation of a C-CAP State-of-the-Art grant.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A GRANT CONTRACT WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE PLANNING FOR A CAREER CRIMINAL APPREHENSION PROGRAM: STATE OF THE ART GRANT FOR "MAJOR CRIME PATTERNS AND SERIES RESPONSE PROJECT"

WHEREAS, the Sacramento Police Department desires to undertake a certain project designated Career Criminal Apprehension Program;

WHEREAS, said program shall consist of a State of the Art Grant for Major Crime Patterns and Series Response Project Module to be funded in part from State General Funds FY 83/84 as authorized by Chapter 1167 of the 1978 Statutes for the Career Criminal Apprehension Program, administered by the Office of Criminal Justice Planning (hereafter referred to as OCJP):

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Walter J. Slipe, City Manager, is authorized to submit the attached Application for Grant for Law Enforcement Purposes to OCJP on behalf of the City Council and is further authorized to execute on behalf of the City of Sacramento the attached Grant Award for law enforcement purposes including any extensions or amendments thereof;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the applicant agrees to provide all matching funds required for said project (including any extension or amendment thereof) under the Career Criminal Apprehension Program and the rules and regulations of OCJP and that cash will be appropriated as required hereby;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant law enforcement expenditures controlled by this body.
