JANUARY 6, 1921

The Honorable City Commission met in Regular Session on this date at 10:20 o'clock A. M., President Bliss presiding.

Roll Call was answered by following Commissioners:

Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Carmichael, Haynes, Turner.

At request of City Clerk, reading of minutes of Regular Meeting of December 30, 1920, Adjourned Meeting of December 31, 1920, Regular Meeting of January 4, 1921 and Finance Committee of January 4, 1921, was dispensed with.

----- As Patrolman in Police Department, W. H. Fubanks furnished bond in sum of \$500 with United States Fidelity & Guaranty Company as surety, form of bond being approved by City Attorney.

Commissioner Carmichael moved that bond be approved. Seconded by Commissioner Turner and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Carmichael, Haynes, Turner.

----- A petition was received from property owners and residents requesting installation of certain street lights in Wright & Kimbrough Tract No. 20. Ordered filed.

Gentlemen:

I herewith transmit letter this day received from Leo H. Susman, Attorney for the P. G. & E. Co., also the contracts in blank therein referred to. The letter and contracts speak for themselves. It will be necessary for the Commission to adopt a resolution authorizing the execution of the contract in the event the stipulations in the contract are satisfactory. The execution of the contract will make it possible for the City to adjust with the electric company temporary arrangements at the filtration site, which will permit of construction being started and prosecuted pending the permanent removal of the existing line to a new location.

My dear Mr. Shinn:

This will acknowledge receipt of your favor of the 4th inst. with reference to the removal of the Pacific Gas & Electric Company's transmission line from the site of the city's filtration plant. I enclose herewith three copies of proposed agreement to be executed by the City of Sacramento and the Pacific Gas & Electric Company covering the matter. I understand that the City of Sacramento owns a sixty foot strip of land in fee which it will be necessary for the company to cross with the wires of its electric transmission line when constructed in the new location, and, as the city's right to grant an interest in any of its property devoted to a public use is to my mind exceedingly doubtful, I have provided at the top of page 3 that if the company shall institute a condemnation suit against the city to acquire the right to maintain its wires across said strip of land the city will reimburse the company for all sums expended by the company in connection therewith. Of course, the condemnation suit will be a friendly suit and it will simply mean that the company will pay the city such sum as the Court may fix and the city will then repay the same to the company, pursuant to the city's covenant in the enclosed agreement.

I am informed by our engineers that the existing right of way is twenty feet and not forty feet, as was at first supposed, but on account of the location of the towers in their new positions it will be necessary for the company to obtain a forty foot right of way.

I am also informed by our engineers that the forms of grants of rights of way covering the tower line in its new location have been delivered to you. If you will, therefore, have the enclosed agreement executed on behalf of the city and have the Auditor sign the certificate at the

bottom of page 5, and will then return the same to me, together with a certified copy of a resolution of the City Commission authorizing the execution of said agreement, and will also send me duly executed and acknowledged, the grants of rights of way above referred to, I will at once have the enclosed agreements executed by the Pacific Gas & Electric Company and return copies thereof to you for the city. Kindly acknowledge receipt hereof, and oblige,

City Attorney presented, with form approved, agreement between City of Sacramento and Pacific Gas & Electric Company regarding removal of towers, poles and wires from filtration plant site.

City Attorney Shinn stated that easement from Frederick A. Warner to Pacific Gas & Electric Company would have to be considered in foregoing agreement and that provision should be inserted to the effect that no attorney's fees would be considered in agreement.

Commissioner Turner requested copy of blueprint attached to agreement for the purpose of presenting same to Arthur E. Miller, Attorney in fact for Frederick A. Warner, owner of adjacent property, and that in his opinion property required for right of way could be obtained at less cost than paid by City for filtration site.

Commissioner Brown moved that the City Attorney be requested to investigate legal complications in foregoing agreement in order that work on filtration plant could be commenced at earliest possible moment.

City Attorney Shinn stated that action should be taken on agreement if possible at meeting on this date.

Commissioner Carmichael stated that he was not ready to vote on said agreement, and moved that Adjourned Meeting of City Commission be called for date of January 7, 1921 at hour of ten o'clock A. M. for the purpose of considering said agreement in connection with other matters presented to City Commission. Seconded by Commissioner Haynes and carried by following vote:

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION, No. 1505

RESOLVED, That it is the intention of the City Commission of the City of Sacramento to order the following Street Work to be done, to-wit:

Improving the alley between H and I Streets, in the City of Sacramento, from the easterly line of 15th Street to the westerly line of 16th Street, by removing and disposing of all refuse and surplus material, constructing three (3) concrete catch basins complete with cast iron curbs and covers and connecting same to sewer with six (6) inch vitrified ironstone sewer pipe; reconstructing one (1) existing concrete manhole by raising same to official grade; grading the alley and constructing thereon an asphaltic concrete pavement five and one-half (5½) inches in thickness.

All of said work shall be done in accordance with plans and specifications adopted for doing said work and now on file in the office of the Superintendent of Streets.

And notice is hereby given that all persons objecting to said work are required to file their objections in writing, in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Sacramento, as required by law, stating how much frontage on said streets is represented by the party so objecting, and on what street the property so represented is located.

And the City Clerk is hereby directed to post this Resolution conspicuously for two days near the door of the Council Chamber of the City Commission; also to publish the same for two days in the Sacramento Union, a daily newspaper as required by law.

The Sacramento Union, a daily newspaper, is hereby designated as the paper in which to publish the Notices required by law to be published by the Superintendent of Streets of said City, in relation to the work described aforesaid.

Specifications read to Commission. Commissioner Carmichael moved that specifications be adopted. Seconded by Commissioner Brown and carried by following vote:

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION No. 1506

RESOLVED by the City Commission of the City of Sacramento, that the work hereinafter men-

tioned is of more than local and ordinary public benefit, and that the public interest and convenience require that said work be done, and that it is the intention of said City Commission to order the same to be done in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, known as the "Improvement Act of 1911", approved April 7th, 1911, and the several Acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, to-wit:

Improving 34th Street in the City of Sacramento from the southerly line of Folsom Boulevard to the northerly line of Fourth Avenue (excepting therefrom the intersections of Stockton Boulevard, First Avenue, Second Avenue, Sacramento Boulevard and Third Avenue), by removing and disposing of all refuse and surplus material, constructing concrete curb and gutter on official line and grade where the same does not exist on official line and grade, constructing concrete manholes complete with cast iron curbs and covers, placing cast iron gutter drains and connecting same to sewer with six (6) inch vitrified ironstone sewer pipe, constructing eight (8) inch vitrified ironstone pipe sewer connecting manhole to manhole and manhole to sewer, grading the roadway and constructing thereon an asphaltic concrete pavement five and one-half (5½) inches in thickness (excepting from the above all work already done to the official line and grade).

All of said work shall be done in accordance with the plans and specifications adopted for doing said work and now on file in the office of the Superintendent of Streets.

That the costs and expenses of said work and improvement shall be chargeable and charged upon the district of lands herein described, which is hereby declared to be the district benefited by said work and improvement, and which is to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof. Said district is bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the southerly line of Folsom Boulevard where the same is intersected by the east line of the alley between 33rd Street and 34th Street, thence to the southwest corner of Lot 66, Yoerk Court (as the same is shown on the official plat thereof on file in the office of the Sacramento County Recorder), thence to the southwest corner of Lot 23, in the said Yoerk Court, thence southerly along the west boundary of the said Yoerk Court, produced southerly, to Stockton Boulevard, thence to the northwest corner of Stockton Boulevard and 34th Street, thence on the west line of 34th Street to the Southern Pacific Railroad Company's right of way, thence along the northerly boundary of the Southern Pacific Railroad Company's right of way to the east line of 31st Street, thence to the south line of S Street, thence to the northeast corner of Lot 6, Mier & Sowell's High School Tract (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof on file in the office of the Sacramento County Recorder), thence to the southeast corner of Lot 47 in the last mentioned tract, thence to the northeast corner of Lot 1, East End Addition (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof on file in the office of the Sacramento County Recorder), thence to the southeast corner of Lot 28, in the last mentioned tract, thence to the northeast corner of Lot 37, T Street Addition (as the same is shown on the official map thereof on file in the office of the Sacramento County Recorder), thence to the southeast corner of said Lot 37, thence to the northeast corner of Lot 9, Allen Tract (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof on file in the office of the Sacramento County Recorder), thence to the southwest corner of Lot 17, in the said Allen Tract, thence to the northeast corner of Lot 12 in the block bounded by Truckee Way, V Street, 33rd and 34th Streets, in the Allen & Leitch Tract (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof on file in the office of the Sacramento County Recorder), thence to the southeast corner of Lot 14, in the block bounded by V Street, W Street, 33rd and 34th Streets, in the last mentioned tract, thence to the northeast corner of Lot 4, in the block bounded by W Street, X Street, 33rd and 34th Streets, thence to the southeast corner of Lot 46, Curtis & Fowley's Addition (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof on file in the office of the Sacramento County Recorder), thence to the northeast corner of Lot 4, Block 6, Oak Park or South Sacramento (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof on file in the office of the Sacramento County Recorder), thence to the southwest corner of Lot 12, Block 45, in the last mentioned tract, thence to the southwest corner of Lot 12, Block 44, in the last mentioned tract, thence to the northeast corner of Lot 4, Block 7, in the last mentioned tract, thence to the northwest corner of 36th and Y Streets, thence along the west line of 36th Street to the south line of V Street, thence to the southeast corner of Lot 8, High School Addition (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof on file in the office of the Sacramento County Recorder), thence to the northeast corner of said Lot 8, thence along the northerly boundary of said High School Addition to the west line of alley between 34th and 35th Streets, thence along the west line of said alley to the south line of alley first south of T Street, thence to the southwest corner of Lot 73, in the aforesaid Mier & Sowell High School Tract, thence to the northeast corner of Lot 57, in the last mentioned tract, thence to the southeast corner of Lot 35, Wright & Kimbrough Tract No. 3 (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof on file in the office of the Sacramento County Recorder), thence to the northeast corner of said Lot 35, thence to the northeast corner of Stockton Boulevard and R Street, thence to the west line of alley first east of 34th Street, thence along west line of said alley to the south line of Folsom Boulevard, thence along south line of Folsom Boulevard to point of beginning. (The distances between points described herein are straight lines.) All as shown on plat of said district approved by the City Commission and now on file in the office of the City Engineer.

Saving and excepting from the above bounden and described district the area of all public streets, alleys, ways and parks included therein.

Notice is hereby given that serial bonds to represent unpaid assessments and bear interest at the rate of seven (7) per cent. per annum will be issued in the manner provided by the Improvement Bond Act of 1915, the last installment of which bonds shall mature nine (9) years from the second day of July next succeeding nine (9) months from their date.

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that on Tuesday, the 27th day of January, 1921, at 11 o'clock A. M., in the Council Chamber of the City Commission of the City of Sacramento, in the City Hall, on I Street, between 9th and 10th Streets, any and all persons having any objections to the proposed work or improvement may appear before said City Commission and show cause why said proposed work and improvement shall not be carried out in accordance with this Resolution.

And the City Clerk is hereby directed to post this resolution conspicuously for two days near the door of the Council Chamber of the City Commission; also to publish the same for two days in the Sacramento Union, a daily newspaper, as required by law.

The Sacramento Union, a daily newspaper, is hereby designated as the paper in which to publish the notices required by law to be published by the Superintendent of Streets of said City, in relation to the work described aforesaid.

----- Commissioner Brown moved that the purported bid presented by Continental Petroleum Company for furnishing fuel oil to different departments of the City of Sacramento for year 1921, received at meeting of December 30, 1920, be rejected, no bid having been presented with said bid in accordance with terms of Charter. Seconded by Commissioner Haynes and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Carmichael, Haynes, Turner, Commissioner Brown stating that communication was not a bid and that the Commissioner of Public Works through Department of Purchasing Agent had been authorized to purchase fuel oil in open market.

Communication from F. Whitehead, Sales Manager of Associated Oil Company, offering to furnish fuel oil to different departments of City in open market at rates as of date purchased, said communication having been received at meeting of December 30, 1920, was discussed and Commissioner Carmichael moved that the City Clerk be directed to notify said Whitehead that the City Commission extends its thanks for the consideration of your Company. Seconded by Commissioner Turner and carried by following vote:

----- Commissioner Turner presented demand of Sacramento Lumber Company in sum of \$595 for lumber furnished to filtration plant, making motion that demand be allowed. Seconded by Commissioner Carmichael and carried by following vote:

----- Commissioner Turner presented payroll of Coast Construction Company in sum of \$481.82 for labor performed at filtration plant.

Commissioner Brown moved that demand be allowed. Seconded by Commissioner Carmichael and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Carmichael, Haynes, Turner.

----- At request of Commissioner of Public Works, Commissioner Haynes moved that action on request of C. E. Jackson to utilize premises No. 1919 O Street for business of rug cleaning, etc., be further postponed until meeting of January 11, 1921. Seconded by Commissioner Carmichael and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Carmichael, Haynes, Turner.

----- Commissioner Bliss reported that he had investigated the complaint made by A. D. Wilgus of gypsies purchasing residence at 3908 Second Avenue, said Wilgus having stated that he had been informed that property had been sold through W. T. Foster, Real Estate Agent, and that he had conferred with said Foster who had strictly objected to statement and had informed him that he has nothing to do with transaction, was not the owner, and that he had, as Commissioner of Public Health and Safety, further investigated and found that H. N. Mitchell, City Prosecuting Attorney, was the attorney who was the representative of the gypsies mentioned, and that the sanitary examination made by Health Department had revealed the fact that the premises were in good condition.

Commissioner Carmichael moved that report of Commissioner of Public Health and Safety be made a matter of record. Seconded by Commissioner Brown and carried by following vote:

----- Vice President Carmichael was called to Chair, and following ordinance was finally considered: Ordinance read to Commission:

ORDINANCE No. _____, THIRD SERIES

An Ordinance regulating the business of Billiard and Pool Parlors in the City of Sacramento requiring a license therefor, and providing a penalty for the violation of said Ordinance.

Commissioner Bliss moved that Section 2 of said ordinance be amended by providing that

statement in writing be presented to the City Clerk in place of City Collector, and that Section 2 be further amended in Subdivision A thereof by inserting the word "Citizenship" after the word "Age" in first line of said Subdivision. Seconded by Commissioner Turner and carried by following vote:

Commissioner Bliss moved that fee to be collected by City Collector and to be inserted in ordinance shall be the sum of \$2 per quarter for each billiard, pool or combination pool and billiard table. Seconded by Commissioner Brown and carried by following vote:

No: Commissioner Turner.

Commissioner Bliss moved that all words appearing in Section 2 after Subdivision C thereof be stricken from said Section. Seconded by Commissioner Haynes and carried by following vote:

No: Commissioner Turner, Commissioner Turner stating that he was opposed to ordinance.

Commissioner Bliss moved that following words be inserted in ordinance in Section 2 after Subdivision C thereof: "Said application shall thereupon be considered by the City Commission, which may either grant or refuse the same". Seconded by Commissioner Haynes and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Carmichael, Haynes.

No: Commissioner Turner.

Commissioner Carmichael moved that Section 5 of said ordinance be stricken from ordinance. Seconded by Commissioner Turner and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Commissioners Brown, Carmichael, Turner.

Noes: Commissioners Bliss and Haynes.

Commissioner Carmichael moved that Section 8 of said ordinance be amended by prohibiting any billiard or pool parlor from being open between the hours of 2 o'clock and 7 o'clock A. M. of any day. Seconded by Commissioner Turner and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Commissioners Brown, Carmichael, Turner.

Noes: Commissioners Bliss and Haynes.

Commissioner Carmichael moved that present Section 9 of Ordinance be stricken from ordinance. Seconded by Commissioner Turner and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Carmichael, Haynes, Turner.

Commissioner Bliss moved that Section 6 of ordinance be re-numbered Section 5, that Section 7 be re-numbered Section 6, that Section 8 be re-numbered Section 7, that Section 8 be re-numbered Section 7, that Section 10 be re-numbered 8, and that Section 11 be re-numbered Section 9. Seconded by Commissioner Carmichael and carried by following vote:

Ayes: Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Carmichael, Haynes, Turner.

Ordinance as amended was thereupon read to Commission.

Commissioner Bliss moved that ordinance as amended be adopted. Seconded by Commissioner Haynes. Commissioner Brown stated that he considered the ordinance absolutely unnecessary at this time and was opposed to ordinance, and roll call on adoption of ordinance resulted as follows:

Thereupon this Ordinance became known and numbered as Ordinance No. 445, Third Series.

----- Commissioner Brown introduced following ordinance:

Ordinance read to Commission:

ORDINANCE No. _____, THIRD SERIES

An Ordinance creating A Purchasing Division for the Filtration Plant Construction of the City of Sacramento, placing the same under jurisdiction of the City Purchasing Agent, authorizing the appointment of a Chief Deputy Purchasing Agent in connection therewith, and prescribing the method of purchasing materials, supplies, etc. for the said Filtration Plant Construction.

Commissioner Haynes moved that rule requiring ordinances to lay over at least one meeting, be suspended for the day. Seconded by Commissioner Brown and carried by following vote:

Commissioner Brown moved that bond mentioned in ordinance be placed at the sum of \$10,000; Seconded by Commissioner Turner and carried by following vote:

Commissioner Bliss moved that Section 3 of Ordinance be amended by adding the following words to Section 3 after the word "ordinance" in last line thereof: "and he shall serve without any compensation for said services". Seconded by Commissioner Brown and carried by following vote:

Ordinance as amended was thereupon read to Commission.

Commissioner Brown moved that ordinance as amended be adopted. Seconded by Commissioner Bliss and carried by following vote:

Thereupon this Ordinance became known and numbered as Ordinance No. 446. Third Series.

Ayes: Commissioners Bliss, Brown, Turner. Absent: Commissioners Carmichael and Haynes.


