**ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 61.401(a) AND  
ADDING ARTICLE XV (SECTIONS 61.1500 THROUGH  
61.1502) TO CHAPTER 61 OF THE SACRAMENTO CITY  
CODE RELATING TO REPAIR AND STORAGE OF  
BOATS IN RESIDENTIAL ZONES**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:**

**SECTION 1**

Section 61.401(a) of the Sacramento City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (a) The keeping, storage, depositing, or accumulation on the premises for an unreasonable period of any personal property, including but not limited to abandoned, wrecked, dismantled, or inoperative vehicles, abandoned, wrecked, dismantled, or not seaworthy boats or vessels, automotive parts and equipment, appliances, furniture, containers, packing materials, scrap metal, wood, building materials, junk, rubbish, and debris, which is within the view of persons on adjacent or nearby real property or the public right-of-way and which constitutes visual blight or reduces the aesthetic appearance of the neighborhood or is offensive to the senses or is detrimental to nearby property or property values; provided, however, that wood and building materials being used or to be used for a project of repair or renovation for which a building permit has been obtained may be stored for such period of time as is necessary expeditiously to complete the project.

**SECTION 2**

Article XV (Sections 61.1500 through 61.1502) is hereby added to Chapter 61 of the Sacramento City Code to read as follows:

**Article XV. Repair and Storage of Boats**

**Sec. 61.1500 Definitions.**

For purposes of this article, the terms "boat" and "vessel" shall include boats, ships, sailboats, barges, and every structure adapted to be navigated from place to place for the transportation of merchandise or persons, whether or not propelled by machinery.

**Sec. 61.1501 Boat Repair.**

It shall be unlawful and a public nuisance for any person to engage in repair or maintenance of any boat or vessel in any residential zone outside a fully enclosed structure, except that repair or maintenance of a boat or vessel may be performed outside a fully enclosed structure where elapsed time between the beginning and end of the repair or maintenance does not exceed forty-eight (48) hours.

**Sec. 61.1502 Boat Storage.**


It shall be unlawful and a public nuisance for any person to store a boat or vessel in any residential zone where it can be seen from the public right-of-way, unless the vessel or boat is currently registered to an occupant of the premises and is placed on a trailer currently registered to an occupant of the premises and parked on a paved surface.
