SUBJECT: Grant Applications: Hall, Henschel and Land Parks Irrigation Projects

SUMMARY

This report recommends formal authorization to submit a grant application under the State 1976 Bond Act to finance irrigation projects at Henschel, Hall and a portion of Land Park. It is necessary under grant application procedures for the City Council to adopt the attached resolution authorizing the grant submittal.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Budget and Finance Committee, at its June 22, 1982 meeting, approved the deletion of the Miller Park diamond lighting project and re-distribution of those grant funds to three automatic irrigation projects to relieve the proposed general revenue sharing funded projects.

The City Council approved in the FY 1982-83 Capital Improvement Program budget these same three irrigation projects: Hall Park (H-16), Henschel Park (H-17), and Land Park (H-25) to be financed by state grant funds. This report recommends formal authorization by Council resolution in the format required under terms of the grant application.

FINANCIAL DATA

Grant funds available under the 1976 Bond Act Program total \$98,000. Individual project costs for each of the three sites are:

Hall Park (H-16)	\$35,000
Henschel Park (H-17)	15,000
Land Park/Phase III (H-25)*	48,000
TOTAL 1976 BOND ACT FUNDS	<u>\$98,000</u>

APPROVED
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*An additional \$99,600 in 1980 Bond Act funds have been appropriated for the Land Park/Phase III project.

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RECOMMENDATION



RESOLUTION NO. 83-263

ADOPTED BY THE SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL ON DATE OF

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE APPLICATION FOR 1976 STATE GRANT MONIES FOR THE INSTALLATION OF AUTOMATIC IRRIGATION AT HENSCHEL, HALL AND LAND PARKS

WHEREAS, the people of the State of California have enacted the State, Urban, and Coastal Park Bond Act of 1976, which provides funds to the State of California and its political subdivisions for acquiring lands and for developing facilities for public recreation and historical purposes; and

WHEREAS, the State Department of Parks and Recreation has been delegated the responsibility for the administration of the program within the State, setting up necessary procedures governing application by local agencies under the program; and

WHEREAS, said procedures established by the State Department of Parks and Recreation require the applicant to certify by resolution the approval of applications prior to submission of said applications to the State; and

WHEREAS, said applications contain assurances that the applicant must comply with; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento will enter into an agreement with the State of California for the development of the project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Sacramento hereby:

1. Approves the filing of an application for 1976 State grant assistance; and
2. Certifies that the City of Sacramento understands the assurances in the application; and
3. Certifies that the City of Sacramento will have sufficient funds to operate and maintain the project; and
4. Certifies that the City of Sacramento has reviewed and understands the General Provisions contained in the State/local agreement; and

Appoints the City Manager as agent of the City to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents including but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments, payment requests, and so on which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned project.
