Additional Description/Analysis

Issue Detail: This serves as a quarterly report on the City's climate action progress, with updates since the last report to City Council on August 16, 2022, as part of the Carbon Neutrality Workshop. Staff have continued to advance key plans and ordinances, pursued grant funding, and prepared to implement new programs. Efforts are highly collaborative, and implemented across departments in the City organization.

As directed at the August 16th City Council meeting, staff accelerated the release of the preliminary public review draft Adaptation section of the Climate Action and Adaptation Plan (CAAP). Staff released this document on October 31, 2022, with the draft Vulnerability Assessment and response to comments on the July 2022 preliminary public review draft CAAP.

Additionally, key policy and ordinance milestones since August include the adoption of the New Building Electrification Ordinance on November 29th, adoption of the Transportation Priorities Plan prioritization on November 15th, and recommendation of the Alternative Water Systems (Dual

Plumbing) Ordinance by the Law and Legislation Committee on November 15.

Work is also underway to advance climate action through City programs and operations:

- City staff received notice of recommendation for a competitive \$350,000 grant award in partnership with SMUD. Grant funds will subsidize electric appliances for low-income housing through the City's Housing Anti-Displacement Program. Staff will bring this agreement to City Council for approval. The City is also leveraging American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding to assist with commercial electrification in the Gardenland/Northgate neighborhood, in partnership with the Sacramento Hispanic Chamber of Commerce and SMUD.
- Climate is integrated as a core tenet of the City's Climate Action and Resiliency Youth and Young Adult Pathways Program, for which staff are currently soliciting government and nonprofit proposals with funding from the CaliforniansForAll Job Corps grant.
- City staff convened public webinars for input on approaches to the forthcoming climate and environmental justice pilot, which will launch in early 2023.
- Planning for City fleet electrification is underway, with design in process for charging infrastructure to support the five-year fleet electrification needs.
- Energy audits continue for City facilities, and staff prepare to implement retrofits with one-time Climate Implementation Work Plan (Work Plan) funding.

In 2023, staff will continue to advance priority efforts. Outreach for the Existing Building Electrification Strategy will re-commence in early 2023, building on early modeling and cost-benefit results, as well as early stakeholder input. Limited staff capacity and competing climate priorities are resulting in delays to the Existing Building Electrification Strategy, but work will continue in early 2023. Public release of the full draft CAAP will occur in early 2023, along with the full draft Sacramento 2040 General Plan. Staff will convene a range of outreach and engagement activities in early 2023 to support community review and feedback on the documents.

A critical issue for continued implementation in 2023 is identification of ongoing funding for climate. Staff will continue to pursue external funding opportunities in collaboration with partners as new opportunities emerge. Staff will continue to prioritize and recommend high-impact opportunities that are feasible to deliver with existing City staff and consultant resources.

Following completion of the CAAP in 2023, City staff will update the Climate Work Plan to serve as the work program reflecting near-term CAAP implementation items, capacity and resources, and the primary supportive or enabling efforts.

Policy Considerations: The City of Sacramento is committed to achieve carbon neutrality by 2045 (Resolution No. 2019-0433). The City's Climate Emergency Declaration advances the City's

commitment to "maximum feasible efforts to implement emergency-speed carbon reduction actions towards eliminating emissions by 2030 as much as possible" (Resolution No. 2019-0465) in collaboration with a range of stakeholders, while evaluating available resources.

Economic Impacts: This staff report does not include recommended action with direct economic impact. However, the City is preparing to implement youth and young adult pathway programs that build on regional green job opportunities. City staff are delaying an update to the City Council on green workforce opportunities until early 2023, to align with the timeline of the Climate Action and Resiliency Youth and Young Adults Pathways Program.

Environmental Considerations: This report does not involve activities that constitute a "project" as defined by Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15378(b)(4) of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines.

Sustainability: The City's climate action initiatives reduce greenhouse gas emissions that contribute to global climate change. These initiatives provide long-term livability and sustainability benefits, while also supporting near-term benefits for residents and such as improving air quality, increasing transportation and mobility options, and more. For example, new buildings that are all-electric can be cheaper to construct and offer ongoing cost savings to residents and tenants.

Commission/Committee Action: The Law and Legislation Committee provided direction for staff to advance new standards for new development related to on-site water reuse and all-electric construction. On September 20, 2022, the Law and Legislation Committee recommended the New Building Electrification Ordinance and Infeasibility Guidelines to City Council (adopted on November 29th); in addition, the Committee provided direction for the framework of a dual plumbing ordinance. On November 15, 2022, the Law and Legislation Committee considered and recommended the Alternative Water Systems (Dual Plumbing) Ordinance to City Council.

Rationale for Recommendation: Quarterly climate reports to the City Council are responsive to City Council direction. These reports provide transparency and accountability on implementation of the City's climate action initiatives.

Financial Considerations: Current efforts in the Climate Work Plan are supported by available funding in the Climate Action Initiatives Program (I02002300), the Energy Efficiency Reinvestment Program (C13001900), and the Active Transportation Program (T15180400), as well as other existing funding.

Long-term, new resources will be needed to fully implement City actions in the CAAP by 2045. Staff estimate a funding gap of \$3.2 billion. Evaluation of funding options and implementation considerations will continue with development and finalization of the CAAP in 2023.
