1.0 CONSENT CALENDAR

1.1 Legislative Update

Recommendation of Staff: Committee Information Only

1.2 AB 1720 (Hannigan) Passenger Rail Service: Capitol Corridor *(continued from June 18, 1996)*

2.0 STAFF REPORTS

2.1 An Ordinance amending Title 30 of the Sacramento City Code relating to Issuance of Letters of Public Convenience or Necessity Pursuant to Business and Professions code Section 23817.7

Recommendation of Staff: Approve Staff Recommendation and Forward to City Council

Committee Action: Approved and forwarded to City Council

Lynne Ohlson, Police Dept., previously, the Police Dept. brought to council an ordinance amending Title 30 which would allow issuance of letters of public convenience or necessity for those who wish to sell alcohol in areas deemed over-concentrated by Alcohol Beverage Control. This would allow exemptions to 3 types of businesses. With council's direction, the Police Dept. is now bringing report back with an additional category that would allow Chief of Police to have discretion in issuing letters of public convenience or necessity to the businesses that did not fall into the 3 previous types of businesses noted in previous report.

Charles Brewer, California Grocers Association, opposed - felt this ordinance discriminated against small retail grocers.

A motion was made by Committee Member Fargo, seconded by Committee Member Waters to forward the attached ordinance to the full City Council for adoption. The motion carried with 3-0 vote. Committee Member Steinberg, sustained from voting.

- 2.2. An Ordinance amending sections 1.01.070, 9.01.009, 9.01.047, 49.02.211, 50.02.203, and 61.02.205 of the Sacramento City Code relating to Imposition of Administrative Penalties

Recommendation of Staff: Approve Staff Recommendation and Forward to City Council

Committee Action: Approved and forwarded to City Council



All in favor. The motion carried with a 4-0 vote.


ADJOURNED - There being no further business to come before the Law & Legislation Committee, the meeting was adjourned at the hour of 1:43 p.m.
