of the City Council

National Brain Tumor Action Week

WHEREAS, each year over 185,000 people in the United States will be diagnosed with a primary or metastatic brain tumor; and

WHEREAS, brain tumors are the leading cause of solid tumor cancer death in children under the age of 20 and the third leading cause of cancer death in young adults ages 20-39; and

WHEREAS, successful prevention and treatment of many types of brain tumors have not yet been achieved, and will require additional resources and research; and

WHEREAS, patients and their families require extraordinary levels of information and support in their struggle against these diseases and every year many members of the Sacramento community are terribly affected by brain tumors; and

WHEREAS, increased public awareness of this major public health problem is a crucial step toward finding solutions; and

WHEREAS, Brain Tumor Action Week is an important tool for educating State and Federal officials and the public on the need for more resources to address this problem.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the City of Sacramento, that we do hereby recognize May 5 – 11, 2002 as national Brain Tumor Action Week and encourage the community to support efforts to improve the resources available to prevent and fight brain tumors and provide support for victims and their families.
