A draft of the mission statement and goals is attached as Exhibit A. This draft attempts to capture the spirit of the themes heard at the July 1 meeting. The mission statement is intended to express the general intent and focus of the Neighborhood and Public Safety Issues Committee. The goals were added to provide more specificity as to how the mission will be carried out. This document is intended to be a 'living document' that can be easily changed and modified to meet the needs of the committee and the community. It may also serve as a general workplan for the committee.
