The Civil Service Board met in special session on the above date at 10 o'clock A. M. in the office of the City Manager, Chairman Nathan presiding.

Present: Commissioners Nathan, Mason, Truesdale.

Absent: None.

Minutes of meeting of December 17, 1925, were read and approved as read.

The Board proceeded to review the examination papers in the examination for Patrolman in the Police Department held on December 6th and 7th, opened the envelopes of the candidates, and thereupon established the following eligible list:

The Board gave further consideration to the request dated November 19, 1925 from the City Council relative to recommendation in connection with proposed ordinance creating minimum wage scale of \$5.00 per day for laborers in the service of the City.

It was the sense of the meeting that report be prepared by the Chairman covering the recommendations of the Civil Service Board, same to be submitted for approval to all members of the board, and presented to the City Council at meeting to be held Thursday, December 24, 1925.
