SUBJECT: PURCHASE OF ONE (1) EACH USED CALAVAR 150' FIREBIRD

The report recommends the City Council authorize sole source purchase of the One (1) used Calavar 150' Firebird and increased appropriation.

BACKGROUND

The Fleet Management Division has a requirement to replace a Fire Department Aerial Ladder Truck. Due to numerous mechanical and safety problems with Equipment No. 614, a 1947 American La France reserve Aerial Ladder, it has become apparent that this vehicle should be replaced as soon as possible.

Inquiries were made to various Fire Apparatus Dealers for prices and availability of new Aerial Ladder Trucks. Prices were quoted from \$280,000 to \$500,000 with six to twelve months delivery. During our inquiries we were informed that Anchorage, Alaska, was interested in selling their Calavar 150' Firebird. After reviewing the vehicle history files and the low hours of usage on the Anchorage unit, it appeared to be a viable alternative to new at a substantial savings. The Calavar representative, O'Neill Seagrave, sent Chief William Powell, Ervin Watts, Fire Repair Shop Supervisor, and R. E. "Gene" Moore, Fleet Management Superintendent, to inspect the Anchorage unit. Based on this inspection, the low mileage (12,376) and the overall condition of this vehicle, it was concluded that the purchase of this vehicle for \$62,600 is an exceptional value.


FINANCIAL DATA

The FY 1984-85 Vehicle Replacement Budget does not provide funding for this requirement. The FY 1984-85 Fleet Management Budget will have to be amended by the appropriation of \$62,600 from the Fleet Management Contingency Reserve.


RECOMMENDATION

RESOLUTION SUSPENDING FORMAL COMPETITIVE BIDDING FOR THE PURCHASE OF ONE (1) EACH USED CALAVAR 150' FIREBIRD AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE NECESSARY CONTRACT; AND AMENDING THE CITY BUDGET FOR FY 1984-85 FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES, FLEET MANAGEMENT DIVISION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO, TWO-THIRDS (2/3) OF ALL MEMBERS VOTING IN FAVOR THEREOF:

1. That pursuant to Section 57.401(c) of the Sacramento City Code, it is hereby determined to be in the best interests of the City to suspend formal competitive bidding for the purchase of one (1) each used Calavar 150' Firebird, and that the City Manager is hereby authorized to execute the necessary contract with O'Neill Seagrave at a total cost of \$62,600.

- a. For the replacement of Equipment No. 614; and
- b. By transferring appropriations from the Fleet Management Contingency Reserve
