Recognizing Historic Highway 40

WHEREAS, U.S. Highway 40 played an important role in the development of transportation routes into California; and

WHEREAS, the California State Legislature has officially recognized the significance of the Historic U.S. Highway Route 40 and has authorized the erection of signs identifying the route throughout Northern California; and

WHEREAS, recognition of the historic highway will educate the public concerning California's development and foster the economic health of the communities and businesses located along its route; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Highway Route 40 brought travelers into downtown Sacramento over the Tower Bridge, circled the State Capitol Building, crossed the American River and continued through North Sacramento and into Citrus Heights; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento recognizes the historical significance of this route and its potential economic benefit.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the City of Sacramento, that we do hereby recognize Historic Highway 40 and do hereby encourage the installation of signage identifying the Historic U.S. Highway 40 route.
