



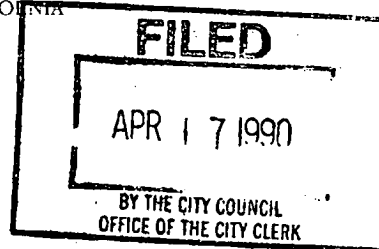

Financial Impact

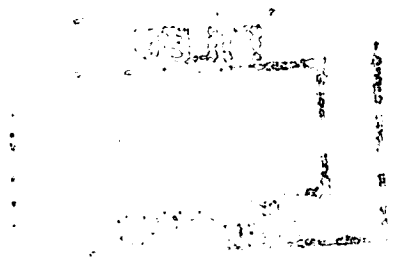
To the extent that any of the listed projects will require funding beyond that already allocated, the City Council will consider funding on a project-by-project basis.

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



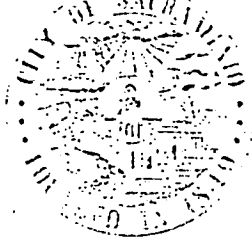

SUBJECT: Transportation/Community Development Committee-
Policy Items For Agenda

Listed below are the major policy matters which are likely to be placed on this committee's agenda during FY 90-91. Bob Lee of the Public Works Department has been consulted about this list. In general, these policy matters fall into three categories (transportation, central city development/redevelopment, and housing).

Also, attached as an information item is a list of major project EIR's currently under way. Except for EIR contracts, these items will be first considered by the Planning Commission before any action by the City Council.

1. Central City Plan -- A request by the Planning Commission and staff to update this 10-year old plan.
2. Southern Pacific/Union Pacific Railyards -- Periodic status reports re: land use plan progress re: S.P, toxic clean-up for both sites, and relocation of the bus depot.
3. Cultural Arts/Entertainment District Master Plan -- Consideration of the Plan and implementation recommendations. Consideration of priorities for funding major cultural facilities.
4. Housing -- Consideration of proposals (jointly recommended by SHRA and Planning staff) for updating the "General Plan" housing element and adopting a more specific housing strategy for the downtown area.

5. Housing Rehabilitation -- REAP and related enforcement proposals.
6. High-Rise Regulations -- Consideration of special Building Code regulations applicable to high-rise structures.
7. Annexation -- Consideration of several annexation proposals (e.g. Freeport, and Cosumnes River areas).
8. Arden-Garden Connector -- Consideration of environmental and design requirements for this project.
9. RT Systems Planning Study -- Consideration of a long-range transit plan for the region.
10. G & H Streets Neighborhood Studies -- Review of follow-up studies as requested by the City Council in 1989.
11. Measure A -- Consideration of priorities in the Highway 160/Business 80 area.
12. Richards Boulevard Connector -- Consideration of the EIR and related capital improvement alternatives.
13. Central City Parking policies -- Consideration of alternative public/private parking standards.

I am prepared to discuss these with you and with Joe Serna, Chair of T & CD, when you are ready.
