**ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 12.82 OF THE SACRAMENTO
CITY CODE BY ADDING SUBSECTION (d) THERETO RELATING
TO SALE OF CITY-OWNED SURPLUS PROPERTY ON CONSIGNMENT**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1

Section 12.82 of the Sacramento City Code is hereby amended to read:

§12.82 Methods of disposition.

The purchasing department shall dispose of surplus property through one of the following methods:

- (a) **Sale at public auction to the highest bidder.** The notice of such auction must be given by publication in the official newspaper of the city no later than ten days prior to such auction. The purchasing department shall reserve the right to reject any and all bids received for any item.

In the event the purchasing department rejects any and all such bids so received, it shall not thereafter sell such property at a price less than the highest bid which it received therefore, until it shall first offer such item to the person who submitted the highest bid for such item, at the price bid. In the event such person refused to purchase such item at such price, the purchasing department may, thereafter, dispose of such property at a lesser price.

- (b) **Sealed proposal;** provided that the restrictions as to rejecting any and all proposals and thereafter selling the property shall be the same as those for public auctions as set forth in part (a) of this section;
- (c) **Incidental sale,** as provided in section 12.83. (Ord. No. 3178, §2)
- (d) **Consignment.** The City Council may, by resolution, determine to dispose of surplus property by putting such property out to sale on consignment if the Council finds that such method of sale is likely to bring the highest price to the city. Such resolution shall set forth the minimum price at which such property shall be sold, and shall call for bids for consignees to sell such property. At the same

time as the Council determines to sell such property on consignment, or later, the Council may, by a resolution adopted by a two-thirds vote, determine to waive competitive bidding on such consignment contract if it determines that such waiver is in the best interests of the city.
