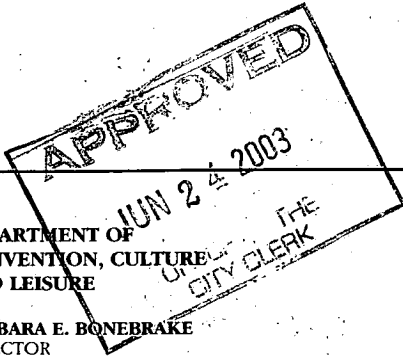

**SUBJECT: Resolution Authorizing Submittal of a California Integrated Waste Management Board FY03/04 Waste Tire Playground Cover Grant Application for Fairytale Town**

**LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:** Fairytale Town, District Four

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the attached resolution authorizing staff to submit a California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) FY03/04 Waste Tire Playground Cover Grant application for the resurfacing of play areas at Fairytale Town.

**SUMMARY:**

This is a request for the City Council to approve the attached resolution authorizing staff to submit a California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) FY03/04 Waste Tire Playground Cover Grant application for the resurfacing of play areas at Fairytale Town. The resolution is a requirement of the grant. Staff will be requesting the maximum allowable grant amount of \$25,000 which must met with a 50% match of

\$12,500. If the grant is awarded the \$35,700 will be used to replace the surfacing under five play structures with pour-in-place rubber surfacing made from 100% California waste tires.

**COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION:**

There is no action required. However, the Fairytale Town Executive Committee and Fairytale Town Board of Directors are expected to support the City's application for the CIWMB grant at their June 12 and June 18 meetings, respectively.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The play structures at Fairytale Town are heavily used and the surfacing is in some cases as much as 17 years old. A few of the structures have only decomposed granite surfacing. The pour-in-place rubber surfacing provides greater cushioning and stability under foot for users. Receiving this grant will allow Fairytale Town to replace approximately 863 square feet of their surfacing with only 1/3 of the funds coming from their budget. Surfacing will be replaced under the Mother Goose, Pirate Ship, Owl's House Slide, Silo Slide, and the Bunny exhibits.

The grant application deadline is June 27, 2003. Grant awards are anticipated for October 2003, with contracts executed by December 2003. The City will have until April 2006 to submit for final reimbursements and close out the grant.

**FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

The City is requesting the maximum allowable grant amount of \$25,000 from the CIWMB for this project. The grant requires a 50% match of \$12,500 in cash value from the City. The match will come from in-kind services through Fairytale Town in the form of groundskeeper time for removal of old surfacing and site preparation, and staff time for grant administration. Grant funds are paid on a reimbursement basis.

**ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

The Environmental Services Manager has determined that the actions of approval of the application for the California Integrated Waste Management Board FY03/04 Waste Tire Playground Cover Grant does not require environmental evaluation. Furthermore, the action of renovating several of the play areas within Fairytale Town located in William Land Park was found to be exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Sections 15301(c), 15301 (d) and 15302 (c). Exemption 15301(c) consists of an existing facility; Exemption 15301(d) consists of restoration of deteriorating facilities; and Exemption 15302(c) consists of the replacement of an existing facility involving no expansion of capacity.


**POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

Application for this grant supports the City's guiding principle of working to sustain existing community facilities and the department's goal of addressing the deferred maintenance and infrastructure challenges of the City's visitor attractions.


**ESBD CONSIDERATIONS:**

All work performed in fulfillment of the grant will be consistent with the City's ESBD policies and procedures.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUBMITTAL OF AN APPLICATION TO THE CALIFORNIA INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT BOARD FOR THE 2003/2004 PLAYGROUND COVER GRANT PROGRAM.**

WHEREAS, the people of the State of California have enacted Assembly Bill 1843 (W. Brown, chapter 974, Statutes of 1989) that provides grants to public entities involved in activities that result in reduced landfill disposal of used whole tires and reduced illegal disposal or stockpiling of used whole tires; and

WHEREAS, the California Integrated Waste Management Board has been delegated the responsibility for the administration of the program for the State, setting up necessary procedures governing program applications; and

WHEREAS, said procedures established by the California Integrated Waste Management Board require the applicant to certify by resolution approval of the application before submission of said application to the State; and

WHEREAS, if awarded a grant, the applicant will enter into a Grant Agreement with the State of California for development of the project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO authorizes the submittal of an application to the California Integrated Waste Management Board for the 2003/2004 Playground Cover Grant Program. Barbara Bonebrake, Director of the Convention, Culture and Leisure Department is hereby authorized and empowered to execute in the name of the City of Sacramento all necessary documents, including but not limited to, applications, agreements, amendments and payment requests necessary to secure grant funds and to implement and carry out the purposes specified in the grant application.
