SUBJECT: Preferential Parking - Mercy Hospital Area

SUMMARY

This report recommends a Preferential Parking Program for the residential area around Mercy Hospital (area map attached as Exhibit "A").

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In February 1980, the City Traffic Engineer received petitions from the residents of this area for a Preferential Parking Program. Surveys and studies of on-street parking conditions in the area were conducted. The results of these surveys and studies are attached as Exhibit "B". Based on these results, it was determined that the area is eligible for this program.

The parking regulations recommended for the area are Residential Permit Parking with two hour limits, Monday through Friday, from 8:00 AM to 6:00 PM. It is also recommended that J Street, from 37th Street to 39th Street, be regulated by conventional two hour limits to prevent all day parking in front of businesses.

A public hearing was held on July 24, 1980. Fifty-seven residents attended this hearing. Comments made at the hearing are shown in Exhibit "C" of this report. The residents voted to support the Preferential Parking Program, but unanimously requested that the regulations be enforced seven days a week. There was also unanimous support for two annual visiton permits per residence. It is recommended that the regulations be five days a week (Monday through Friday) and that one annual visitor permit per residence be issued. Enforcement is only practical five days a week, Monday through Friday, because only two traffic control checkers are on duty Saturdays and none are on duty Sundays. Visitor permits should be limited to one per residence so that control can be maintained. The program makes provisions for additional temporary visitor permits to be issued as needed.,



Comments from residents at public hearing:

K Street residents wish to be excluded from program and included later if problems occur. They wish to be included at this time only if more than one visitor permit per residence is provided.

Addresses of permittees should be put on permits.

Area boundaries should be increased, to prevent parking congestion from shifting to other blocks.

One visitor permit per residence should be issued with regulations enforced seven days a week.

Unlimited visitor permits should be issued to each residence as needed.

No parking should be allowed on 39th Street between J and K.

Two visitor permits per residence should be allowed.

Not in favor of program because of the inconvenience to pick up permits.

RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE MERCY HOSPITAL AREA AS RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

Pursuant to Section 25.174 of the Sacramento City Code, the area known as the Mercy Hospital Area is hereby established as a Residential Permit Parking Area. Parking on the public streets within the area boundaries, as shown on the attached map, shall be regulated by parking restrictions. Vehicles which display valid Residential Parking Permits or Visitor Parking Permits issued for use in the Mercy Hospital Area shall be exempt from said parking restriction in appropriately designated areas.

Residential Parking Permits shall be issued to each residential vehicle of the area, upon application by the resident owner to the Office of the Traffic Engineer. Current vehicle ownership registration, issued by the State of California, shall be required as proof of residential vehicle ownership and residence. Each residence shall be entitled to one annual Visitor Permit upon application by the respective resident to the Office of the Traffic Engineer and by showing proof of residence in the area by current California vehicle ownership registration, a current California driver's license, or other proof as deemed appropriate by the Traffic Engineer. Said Residential Permits and Visitior Permits shall be valid for one full year from the date of issuance. Additional Temporary Visitor Permits may be issued to area residents by application to the Office of the Traffic Engineer. Said Temporary Visitor Permits shall be issued at the discretion of the Traffic Engineer.

Upon receipt of a petition from the area described herein to be established as a Residential Permit Parking Area, signed by residents representing over 50% of the dwelling units within the area boundaries, the Traffic Engineer shall implement the Residential Permit Parking Program as described herein.

All red, yellow, blue, white and green zones will remain in effect if located on a block designated for Residential Permit Parking.

The following public streets in the Mercy Hospital area shall be regulated by two-hour time limits from 8:00 AM to 6:00 PM, Monday through Friday. Vehicles displaying Residential Parking Permits or Visitor Parking Permits issued for use in the Mercy Hospital area shall be exempt from said two hour limits.

37th Street, west side, from J Street to M Street.

37th Street, east side, from J Street to M Street.

38th Street, west side, from the south boundary of the parcel at 514 - 38th Street to M Street.

38th Street, east side, from the south boundary of the parcel at 509 - 38th AUG 191980 as amended Street to M Street.

- 39th Street, west side, from the south boundary of the parcel at 532 39th Street to J Street.
- 39th Street, west side, from the south boundary of the Sacred Heart Church frontage to M Street.
- 39th Street, east side, from the south boundary of the parcel at 533 39th Street to H Street.
- 39th Street, east side, from J Street to M Street.
- San Miguel, west side, from the south boundary of the parcel at 532 San Miguel to H Street.
- San Miguel, east side, from the south boundary of the parcel at 533 San Miguel to H Street.
- San Antonio, west side, from the south boundary of the parcel at 532 San Antonio to H Street.
