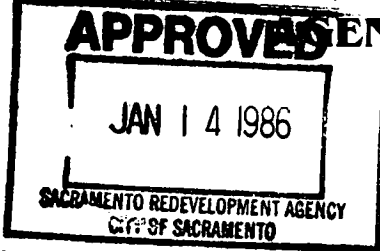

SUBJECT: Revisions to Old Sacramento Waterfront Financing
Related to Delta King and GLOBE

SUMMARY

The City Council, by previous action, committed the Agency to provide funding up to \$400,000 for access and moorage facilities for the Delta King. In Addition, in order for the GLOBE to connect to the Delta King and become operational a number of health, safety and occupational items need to be completed. Specific activities for these two projects are identified and transfers of existing Old Sacramento funds are recommended to cover costs.

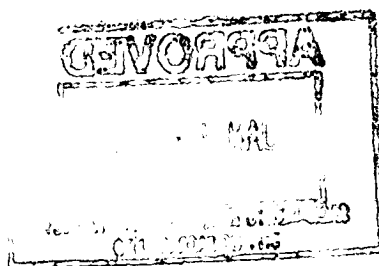
BACKGROUND

Delta King

On September 11, 1985 the City Council approved a long-term lease with the developers of the Delta King riverboat. The Council directed Agency staff to prepare a report regarding the Agency's financing of access and moorage facilities for the Delta King (Cost Center 0495) in an amount not to exceed \$400,000. The Agency responsibilities will include the following items:

- a. Construction and installation of four gangways to Delta King.
- b. Construction and installation of floating pedestrian linkages from the Delta King to the GLOBE.

- c. Reimbursement to Delta King developers for legitimate costs related to driving of piles for permanent moorage, provided that piles are found to be acceptable and adequate by licensed Engineer.
- d. Engineering design and supervision for above, including utilities from Delta King to sea wall.
- e. Installation of a deadman and completion of the moorage system as needed.
- f. If funds are still available within the overall budget the construction and installation of a dumbwaiter system for goods (not an elevator for passengers) in conjunction with two gangways.

Developer responsibilities related to access and moorage include:

- a. Cost and installation of utility connection from Delta King to dockside.
- b. Connection of Delta King to moorage support.

GLOBE

The GLOBE as mentioned in the approved Use and Leasing Plan for the Old Sacramento Riverfront will be used in a number of ways, e.g. 1) historically it was a store ship and therefore it will have a small interior retail use with possibilities of the deck space used during good weather through a concessionaire for limited food service (off-site prepared food), 2) in conjunction with the retail space, displays are planned of the waterfront through various interpretive material such as historic and recent photographs, artifacts, etc., 3) historically the GLOBE also functioned as a landing facility for sailing ships to tie up to when they were in port - this same function will be replicated by having tour boats tie up to the GLOBE as needed, and 4) because of its unique character and location there may be opportunities for lease of the GLOBE for special events such as parties, weddings, etc.

In order for the GLOBE (Cost Center 0485) to accomplish all of the activities listed above, to meet various health, safety and occupancy considerations and prior to final berthing at its historic location the following items need to be completed:

a. Fire protection system	\$ 7,000
b. Electrical	17,000
c. Mechanical (includes store head)	8,000
d. Historic canvas enclosure	3,000
e. Deck fittings for hardware to accommodate tour boats	1,100
f. Historic store and interpretive materials	7,900
g. On board security and caretaker's accommodations	38,000
h. Wage adjustment to comply with State prevailing wage regulations during initial construction of GLOBE	130,000
i. First year maintenance	17,000
j. Completed extras related to GLOBE launch and security	9,500
k. Floating pedestrian connectors from GLOBE to Barge	68,500
l. Contingency	<u>25,000</u>
Total Estimated Cost	\$332,000
<u>GRAND TOTAL FOR GLOBE & DELTA KING</u>	<u>\$732,000</u>

FINANCIAL DATA

In order to finance the Delta King and GLOBE completion the following funds shall be used:

1. Deferring of a portion of Cost Center 0494 (Riverfront - Phase II)	\$383,000
2. Deferring Barge enhancement Cost Center 0483	60,000
3. Defunding of Old Sacramento sidewalk replacement Cost Center 0452 with concurrence from City Manager's Office to augment sidewalk replacement program with City funds.	<u>289,000</u>



SUBJECT: Report Back on Sidewalk Replacement Funding

SUMMARY

This report recommends that the City assume the responsibility for the remaining portion of the Old Sacramento sidewalk replacement program within the current capital budget for the Handicapped Access Compliance Program.

BACKGROUND

On January 7, 1986 the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency proposed defunding their Old Sacramento sidewalk replacement program (\$289,000) in order to finance the Delta King and GLOBE project. The Agency report also stated that the City would provide replacement funding for the sidewalk program. The Budget and Finance Committee requested staff to identify an alternative source of funding for the sidewalk replacement.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Old Sacramento sidewalk replacement program be included in the scope of the Handicapped Access Compliance Program. The current budget for this CIP project is \$718,000 of which approximately \$600,000 is unencumbered at this time. The sidewalk replacement program, which does include handicapped access provisions, could be funded within this balance. Staff is currently reviewing the projects which will be delayed as a result of this additional requirement. A list of the City facilities affected are attached.

SECTION 12 - PENALTY

38

It shall be unlawful for any person to violate any provision or to fail to comply with any of the requirements of this ordinance. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance or failing to comply with any of its requirements shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment not exceeding six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Each such person shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each day during any portion of which any violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance is committed, continued or permitted by such person, and shall be punishable therefore as provided for in this ordinance.

SECTION 13 - CONSTITUTIONALITY

If any section, sub-section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The Council hereby declares that it would have adopted the ordinance and each section, sub-section, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, sub-sections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared invalid.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to cause this ordinance to be published.
