

Sacramento, California,

August 10, 1931.

The Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento met in special session on the above date at seven o'clock P. M. in the office of the Board, Room 106 City Hall, President <sup>Weisman</sup> Chenu presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Maloney and Weisman.  
ABSENT ; Commissioner Chenu.

The minutes of the special meeting of July 27th and August 3, 1931, were read and approved as read.

Resolution #178 adopted by the City Council August 6, 1931, relative to the prevailing wage scale to be maintained by the work performed on contracts with the City of Sacramento was read and ordered filed.

Commissioner Maloney moved that an additional leave of absence of thirty days beyond the ninety days already approved be granted to Walter G. Faig, with the right to return to his position upon expiration of the leave. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Weisman. The vote was as follows:

NOES: None. ABSENT: Commissioner Chenu.

Commissioner Maloney moved that an additional leave of absence of thirty days beyond the ninety days already approved be granted C. M. Ryon, with the right to return to his position upon expiration of the leave. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Weisman. The vote was as follows:

NOES: None. ABSENT: Commissioner Chenu.

Reports were presented to the Board showing leaves granted Mrs. Jessie Malarin of the Recreation Department and Viola

Johnson of the Health Department. It was found that these employees had service of less than one year and consent to their leave would first have to be obtained from the Civil Service Board. Commissioner Maloney moved that Mrs. Jessie Malarin and Viola Johnson be granted the leave as stated in the report submitted by their department head, in accordance with the provisions of the Civil Service Rules. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Weisman and the vote was as follows:
