AUGUST 13, 1953

WHEREAS, This City Council in Resolution No. 297 adopted April 5, 1951 declared that necessity and public interest required the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Sacramento to avail itself of the financial assistance provided by Title I of the Housing Act of 1949, to assist local slum clearance and urban redevelopment projects and approved the filing by said Agency of an application for a preliminary advance of funds in the amount of \$62,127 from the Housing and Home Finance Agency; and

RESOLUTION NO. 477 (Cont'd)

WHEREAS, The Housing and Home Finance Agency made available to the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Sacramento an advance of \$62,127 for its use in undertaking certain surveys and plans in connection with redevelopment projects situated in Sacramento within areas known as: (a) Redevelopment Area No. 1, (b) Survey Area A and (c) Survey Area E; and

WHEREAS, The original contract dated July 12, 1951 was amended on February 8, 1952 to revise the boundaries of Redevelopment Area No. 1 and again on June 24, 1952 to increase the amount of said contract to \$129,230 for the purpose of continuing surveys and planning in the afore-said areas and to redelineate study areas; and

WHEREAS, it has become necessary for said Redevelopment Agency to avail itself of the financial assistance provided by Title I of the Housing Act of 1949 and to make application for additional funds in the amount of \$56,600 from said Housing and Home Finance Agency in order to continue its planning and surveys of Redevelopment Area No. 1 and in particular Project Area No. 2-A selected by the City Planning Commission on July 14, 1953; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that surveys be made and other activities be performed preparatory to undertaking redevelopment projects; and

WHEREAS, it is recognized that Title I of the Housing Act of 1949 requires that contracts for financial assistance thereunder impose certain obligations and responsibilities upon local public agencies availing themselves of such financial assistance, including among other things: (1) the approval of the redevelopment plan by the governing body of the locality in which the project is situated, with appropriate findings (a) that financial aid by the Federal Government is necessary, (b) that the redevelopment plans for the redevelopment areas in the locality will afford maximum opportunity, consistent with the sound needs of the locality as a whole, for the redevelopment of such areas by private enterprise, and (c) that the redevelopment plan conforms to a general plan for the development of the locality as a whole; (2) the provision of local grants-in-aid; (3) the development of a feasible method for the relocation of families displaced from the project area; and (4) the several other local obligations and responsibilities that are imposed pursuant to Title I of the Housing Act of 1949 in connection with the undertaking and carrying out of slum clearance and urban redevelopment projects; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Title I every contract for a Federal capital grant will require local grants-in-aid in connection with the project which, together with the local grants-in-aid to be provided in connection with all other projects of the local public agency on which contracts for Federal capital grants have been made, will be at least equal to one-third of the aggregate net project costs involved in such projects; and

WHEREAS, Such local grants-in-aid may be provided by a state, municipality or other public body, or by any other entity, and may consist of donations of cash, land, demolition, or removal work, and streets, utilities, or other site improvements, and the provision of parks, playgrounds, and other public buildings or facilities which (1) are primarily of direct benefit to the project area or (2) are of direct and substantial benefit both to the project and to other areas in the community; and

WHEREAS, This Council recognizes the need for the ultimate redevelopment or rehabilitation of property within the boundaries of Redevelopment Area No. 1.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO, CALIFORNIA, as follows:

Section 1. That the financial assistance provided by Title I of the Housing Act of 1949 to assist local slum clearance and urban redevelopment projects is necessary; and

Section 2. That it is fully cognizant of the foregoing obligations and responsibilities that are imposed under contracts for financial assistance pursuant to Title I and it is the sense of this body that such obligations and responsibilities can and will be fulfilled; and

Section 3. That the filing of an application by the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Sacramento, California for financial assistance from the Housing and Finance Administrator under Title I for surveys and plans for the following general area: Redevelopment Area No. 1, Sacramento, California, in the amount of \$56,600.00, be and is hereby approved; and

Section 4. That the City Council believes that proposed Project Area 2-A, selected by the City Planning Commission on July 14, 1953, at the request of the City Council, is the best location for beginning a long range redevelopment program. This decision was reached by the Council and City Planning Commission as a result of the extensive and detailed planning studies by the Redevelopment Agency in cooperation with the Division of Slum Clearance and Urban Redevelopment.

Section 5. That the City Council believes that public hearings, bond issues, securing of redevelopers and other matters which may be necessary to the redevelopment of a project will stand the greatest chance of success if proposed Project Area 2-A is continued.

Section 6. That the City Council will continue to cooperate with the Redevelopment Agency in furthering the progress of proposed Project 2-A.
