FY 1979-80 Budget

## SUMMARY

This report indicates that there is a strong probability that transient occupancy tax revenues received for FY 1979-80 will be less than planned. The attached Resolution is required to alleviate any budgetary deficit in the Community Center Fund and the City General Fund.

## BACKGROUND

Transient occupancy tax (hotel/motel) revenues for FY 1979-80 are not being realized as anticipated. This is because of:

- A) The emerging recession adversely affecting travel.
- B) Fears surrounding Proposition 9 have adversely affected the number delegates attending state government conferences.
- C) Reduced credit card usage as a result of recent Federal Reserve Board consumer credit restrictions.

# FINANCIAL

Following is a recap comparing the FY 1979-80 budget to the current projection for transient occupancy (T.0.) tax:

	9% to Community Center Fund	1% to Convention Bureau	10% Total
ADOPTED FINAL 1979-80 BUDGET:	\$2,390,000	\$265,000	\$2,655,000
CURRENT PROJECTION, 1979-80: (Worst Case)	1,953,000	217,000	2,170,000
SHORTFALL: (Worst Case)	\$ 437,000	\$ 48,000	\$ 485,000

The above figures indicate the potential for up to a \$485,000.00 shortfall. The Community Center Fund does not have funds available to absorb much more than \$75,000.00 - \$100,000.00 shortfall.

In order to alleviate this potential problem and avoid an unauthorized operating budget overrun, a budget amendment is required.

## RECOMMENDATION

Approval of the attached Resolution authorizing amendment to the FY 1979-80 Budget.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TO AMEND THE FY 1979-80 COMMUNITY CENTER BUDGET TO THE EXTENT REQUIRED BY A SHORTFALL IN CITY TRANSIENT OCCUPANCY TAX REVENUE RECEIPTS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

That to the extent FY 1979-80 transient occupancy tax revenues are less than budgeted, the Director of Finance is authorized to:

- A) First, reduce the \$351,316.00 planned Community Center payback to the City of Sacramento General Fund, and;
- B) Second, utilize FY 1979-80 Community Center Operating Budget savings as required to cover revenue shortfalls in the Community Center Fund.
