Description/Analysis

Issue Detail: Discuss the proposed location and artists for Phase 1 of the Temporary Public Art Application (TPAA) program review for a temporary mural to be located at the Lawrence Park Restroom facilities, 5130 McGlashan Street, Sacramento. As a community inspired project, the applicant wishes to paint images she shared with community on the bathroom facility at the park. As part of the City's Temporary Public Art Policy, which guides the TPAA process, the Commission should review, discuss, and vote recommending approval or disapproval of the application. The application is currently circulating with all affected divisions within Public Works, Parks, and Facilities. If the location is approved, the applicant will be invited to submit designs and City staff will prepare a draft license agreement. The Commission would then revisit this application during the Phase 2 review for final approval. As a component of the TPAA program, the applicant will be responsible for all costs, provide the required insurance for installation, and be responsible for maintenance of the mural. The anticipated lifespan for the mural is 10 years with an option to extend the agreement for an additional 10 years.

Policy Considerations: The Arts, Culture, and Creative Economy Commission (ACCEC) is charged with providing for the nature, selection, and placement of artworks.

Furthermore, the recommendations in this report are in alignment with Creative Edge: Sacramento's Arts, Culture and Creative Economy Plan (Creative Edge), which was adopted by the City Council on July 3, 2018, and which serves as the guiding policy framework for the Office of Arts and Culture.

ACCEC serves, in part, to support and advance six goals identified within Creative Edge, intended to fulfill the Sacramento community's vision for its arts, cultural and creative future.

This item addresses the following six (6) Creative Edge goals:

Goal 1: Provide arts education to all Sacramento's children and youth; Goal 2: Advance cultural equity for all Sacramento's diverse populations; Goal 3: Build upon and expand Sacramento's unique creative economy; Goal 4: Enable Sacramento artists and creatives to thrive in their work and to provide creative leadership in the community; Goal 5: Celebrate and infuse all Sacramento neighborhoods and districts with arts and culture; and Goal 6: Expand and solidify Sacramento's investment in arts and culture.

This item also addresses the following five (5) 2025 ACCEC Workplan goals:

Goal 1: Achieve greater clarity around ACCEC's purpose and role within the City of Sacramento government; Goal 2: Enhance community awareness and understanding of ACCEC as a supportive, accessible resource dedicated to arts and culture; Goal 3: Advocate for City of Sacramento policies and initiatives that value, support, and build the arts and cultural community and ecosystem; Goal 4: Collaborate with the Office of Arts and Culture to address a variety of infrastructure needs required to sustain a thriving and sustainable arts ecosystem; Goal 5: Continue to work with the Office of Arts and Culture in uplifting the goals of the Creative Edge Plan.

If the ACCEC approves this item by motion, it will advance to Phase 2 review as contemplated under the City's Temporary Public Art Policy.

Environmental Considerations: None, as the recommendations in this report do not constitute a

“project” under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) as they involve government fiscal activities that do not involve any commitment to a specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment, as contemplated by Section 15378(b)(4) of the CEQA Guidelines (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, §15000 et seq.), and is, therefore, not subject to CEQA pursuant to Section 15060(c)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines.

Rationale for Recommendation: The TPAA program gives community members and others the ability to propose projects on city property and outlines the two-phase procedure to review these project proposals. While the TPAA is still circulating for comments throughout departments in the City, the Office of Arts and Culture (OAC) would like to use this project to learn from the new procedures in action. OAC staff has reviewed this application and supports the idea in concept as long as other city departments and the Commission also support a mural at this location at Lawrence Park.

Financial Considerations: No city funding is required for this project. This project will be a licensed display as part of the city’s temporary public art collection and all maintenance will be handled by the Licensee.

7. Project Description / Overview:

The Lawrence Park Mural will be a community-designed public artwork celebrating the neighborhood's cultural diversity through bold, illustrative imagery and intentional Marshallese representation, while also reflecting the broader Lawrence Park community. The mural will be shaped by resident input and painted together during a Spring community mural paint day, transforming the park building into a shared cultural landmark visible to all passersby.

Each of the building's four walls will highlight a different aspect of the community. The west-facing wall will pay homage to Lawrence Park's origins in the 1950s, inspired by a vintage "Greetings From _____" postcard style. The south wall will celebrate the neighborhood's large Marshallese population. The east wall will reflect the diverse community members who use the park throughout the day, while the north-facing wall—overlooking the basketball court—will honor the love of basketball and the bonds formed through shared passion for the game.

8. Brief explanation about installation and de-installation process (be brief but specific please):

The mural installation will be completed within one week. Art By Brey will prepare the wall surfaces and sketch the design on all four walls within the first three days. A public mural paint day will then be hosted in collaboration with the Lawrence Park Neighborhood Association, inviting community members to assist in painting the mural. Volunteers will be guided on specific sections and color areas to ensure a cohesive final design.

The following day, Art By Brey will refine line work, clean edges, and complete final details to ensure the mural is fully finished and polished. As this mural is intended as a long-term public artwork with an expected lifespan of at least ten years, a de-installation process is not anticipated. Art by Brey will be in charge of any maintenance needed.

Activity Overview & Alignment with Creative Edge Plan Goals:

Completing a Community Mural/Involvement Day: The mural will serve as the centerpiece of this project, guiding all planning and engagement efforts. The process begins with attending Lawrence Park Neighborhood Association meetings and reviewing previous community response surveys to understand resident priorities and preferences. These insights will inform initial mural concepts that reflect the diversity of the neighborhood, including the Marshallese population, while ensuring the design resonates with all community members. Draft designs will be presented to residents for feedback, discussion, and refinement, allowing the community to have a direct voice in shaping the final artwork. Once the design is finalized and approved by the City of Sacramento, a spring community event will be planned to complete the mural, providing hands on painting opportunities for residents. The event will be part of a larger Spring Fling celebration, featuring inflatable jumpers, snow cone machines, and other activities to create a festive, welcoming environment. Local organizations, banks, and resource providers will also be invited to table at the event, offering information and services to attendees and further connecting the mural project to the broader community. Throughout the process, the mural remains the focal point, with every step, from concept development to community painting, centered on cultivating collaboration and ensuring resident input guides the outcome.

Creative Edge Plan Goals:

Goal 2: Advance cultural equity for all Sacramento's diverse populations. The mural honors the Marshallese community while ensuring all neighbors feel seen, represented, and reflected. By centering resident voices through Neighborhood Association meetings and previous community surveys, the project directly promotes cultural equity.

Goal 3: Build upon and expand Sacramento's unique creative economy. By creating Lawrence Park's first public art, the project stimulates local creative activity, encourages community-driven artistic participation, and highlights the value of arts in everyday public spaces.

Goal 4: Enable Sacramento artists and creatives to thrive and provide creative leadership. This project allows me, as an artist, to exercise creative leadership, mentor and inspire future local artists, and demonstrate that community-driven art is possible.
