SUBJECT: THIRD QUARTERLY REPORT FROM SACRAMENTO CABLE TELEVISION (SCT)

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Council receive and file the third quarter report and this update.

THIRD QUARTER REPORT

The attached staff report summarizes activities of SCT and the Cable Television Commission for the quarter ending September 30, 1987.

There have, however, been many significant actions regarding SCT which overshadow the assumingly routine items in the attached quarterly report.

SETTLEMENT WITH SCT

As has been reported in the press, SCT sued the government entities for relief from franchise commitments and failed to make the required November franchise fee and grant payments to the Commission and the community programming entities. This led to a countersuit being filed by the government entities. The government's lawsuit, coupled with negative media publicity directed toward SCT from a press conference held by Chairman Kastanis of the Cable Television Commission, Mayor Rudin, and Board of Supervisors Chairman Toby Johnson resulted in representatives from Sacramento Cable Television and its Scripps-Howard parent meeting with Commission staff in a series of lengthy negotiations. These talks resulted in execution of a Memorandum of Understanding on December 7, 1987, to settle the major issues between the entities.

In summary, SCT has agreed to immediately pay \$15.3 million, in lump sum, in return for an extended franchise totalling 40 years, relief from most franchise obligations which are in excess of those required of a licensee, reduced costs for use of the public easements, and relief from community programming funding requirements.

SCT will then pay a reduced level of franchise fees over the balance of the franchise regardless of any future legal decisions on the proprietary of franchise fee payments. Further, the community programming Grantees will be funded by the Commission at a level consistent with their base funding in the last fiscal year of approximately \$600,000. The \$15.3 million and the long-term guaranteed payments by SCT will maintain the community Grantees funding in perpetuity.

The Memorandum of Understanding is currently being converted into a binding legal document by the various legal counsels and will be effective as soon as it is executed by all parties, and approved by Judge Schwartz, the presiding judge on the cases.

Due to the settlement, this will be the last quarterly report from SCT. However, staff will continue to report on cable and Commission activities to you each quarter.

CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS

SCT reports that it will have completed construction of the entire Imposed Service Area by the Spring of 1988, and projects that all those wanting cable service will have had an opportunity to do so by July or August of 1988. Currently, as reported by Dick Davis, SCT Chief Executive Officer, there are approximately 93,000 cable subscribers in Sacramento County. In addition, Cable Americal has completed construction of its license for a small area immediately north of the Capehart Housing Project in North Highlands; and Pacific West has been granted an unconditional license to construct its cable system in the Land Park area of the City of Sacramento and also the Arden-Arcade area in the County of Sacramento. Pacific West is expected to begin construction in the next two weeks.

Therefore, it is recommended that you receive and file this third quarterly staff report of SCT and this update.

SUBJECT: SACRAMENTO CABLE TELEVISION AND SACRAMENTO METROPOLITAN CABLE TELEVISION COMMISSION THIRD QUARTER 1987 REPORT

GENERAL

This report summarizes the significant activities of Sacramento Cable Television (SCT) and the Commission during the third quarter of 1987 in each of seven areas: Administration, Construction, Design/Engineering, Services, Affirmative Action/Employment, Community/Government Programming, Consumer Protection/Complaints/Inquiries. This report has been delayed until now because of the lengthy commission agendas of the past two months.

A copy of the 1987 Third Quarter Report (Attachment 2) has been filed with the City Clerk. A copy of these reports are also on file at the Commission's office for public inspection.

As of the end of the Quarter, SCT completed 2,472.53 miles of construction, including 307.33 miles of joint-trench in new subdivisions and multi-unit construction. This represents 119% of the construction mileage target of 2,046.5 miles.

2. The table below compares the third quarter construction totals to the Census Tract Progression Schedule.

3. The low income completion percentage has gone from 51% to 68% to 81% over the past 3 quarters. SCT has certified that they will be in compliance with the census tract progression by the end of the first quarter of 1988. In the third quarter, SCT added 623.8 miles of plant and are at 84% of the original system total of 2,908 miles.
4. SCT has also completed service connections to 98 schools and 34 institutions for a total of 132 of the 640 facilities estimated in the system.

AFFIRMATIVE ACTION/EMPLOYMENT

As part of their third quarter 1987 report, SCT submitted a detailed report indicating the progress they are making toward achieving their affirmative action goals as specified in the Cable Franchise Resolution. A summary of SCT's progress during the third quarter of 1987, July - September, is attached as Attachment 1. Below is a comparison of the Resolution goals and the progress made by SCT in meeting those goals for last quarter. Staff numbers are listed in full-time equivalents (FTE).

Goal 1) 23% of all locally purchased goods and services to be procured from minority and female owned (MBE/FBE) vendors.

During the third quarter, 11.4% (\$633,428) of SCT's local procurements were made through minority and female-owned vendors. This represents a 5% decrease from last quarter's total. Their to-date total is 15.5%, a 1.5% decrease from last quarter.

Goal 2) Preference given to local persons for employment and local firms for contracting opportunities.

As of September 30, 1987, 87.4% (318.25) of SCT's work force were local residents. This is a 2% increase over last quarter's total. Of the dollars spent in construction contracts during the third quarter, 39.7% of the dollars were spent with local construction firms, a 1.3% decrease from the previous quarter. 84.5% of SCT's procurement contract went to local vendors, a 10% decrease from last quarter.

Goal 3) Achieving population parity in employment for minorities (23%), women (51%), and the disabled community (5%).

Sacramento Cable Television's overall work force increased by 10% (36 persons) during the third quarter, bringing their total number of employees to 364.25.

As of September 30, 1987, 32.7% (119.2) of SCT's full-time work force were minorities, 38.5% (140.25) were female, and .3% were from the

disabled community. These totals represent a 5% increase from last quarter's minority total (27%) and a .5% decrease in the female total (39%). SCT's disabled work force decreased by 50% (1 person) from last quarter. The total hours worked by minorities in the construction contractor's work force was an average of 34.7% (128 workers) for the third quarter, a 9% decrease from last quarter. Females worked on the average of 1% (4 workers) of the construction hours, a 2% drop from last quarter.

Goal 4) Awarding 23% of all construction dollars to minority and female owned businesses.

Of the total dollars SCT spent during the third quarter, 1987, on construction contracts, 24.7% (\$1,387,142) went to minority and female-owned construction contractors. Last quarter's total was 39%, resulting in a 14% decrease.

Goal 5) Providing barrier free access to all facilities.

No new facilities were added by Sacramento Cable Television during this quarter.

Goal 6) Implementing training and scholarship programs outlined in the application.

There was no training or scholarship activity during the third quarter of 1987.

Overall, SCT made a large increase in meeting their affirmative action goals for internal minority hiring while female hiring dropped slightly during the third quarter of 1987. However, significant increases were made in minority and female representation in the officials and managers job category. Decreases are noted in MBE/FBE participation in procurement and construction contracts.

COMMUNITY/GOVERNMENT PROGRAMMING

SCT expended a total of \$186,863 during this quarter in direct operating grants to the community grantees. In addition, SCT expended a total of \$48,153 for in-kind staff grants to the grantees during the third quarter. Below is a summary of each grantees activities during the third quarter 1987.

KVIE. KVIE, Cable 20, produced 6.5 hours of local community productions during the third quarter of 1987, exceeding their goal of 2 hours per month. These 6.5 hours of programming resulted in 12 local programs covering such topics as book reviews, pet care, and Sacramento resources. A total of 1,978 video programming hours were cablecast during the third quarter; 107 hours were original community use programming. KVIE's part-time publicist has been very successful in promoting Cable 20's programming

to the local Sacramento media. Because of SCT's late grant payment, KVIE Cable 20 stopped playback on November 6, 1987 and has not restarted cablecasting.

Sacramento Educational Cable Consortium. The Cable Consortium programmed approximately 40 hours per week of video programming for the months of July, August, and September for a total of 540 hours. Of these video hours, more than 180 were original, locally produced programs, averaging 13-3/4 hours per week. Local programs were produced by elementary schools, Los Rios Community College District, California State University Sacramento, University of California Davis, and by the Educational Consortium itself.

Sacramento Community Cable Foundation. In response to litigation between the Commission and Sacramento Cable Television, the Foundation scaled back many activities planned for the third quarter. However, they continued to maintain their programming obligations. 248 original programs were presented on the Foundation's two community use channels during the third quarter of 1987, an average of 12 hours per week of original programming. This is in excess of their 11 hours per week contractual obligation. Major programs produced during the third quarter included coverage of high school and college football games, Sacramento Kings Pro-Am Summer League Games, Oak Park summer concerts, and the NAACP Blues Festival. Currently, the Foundation has 1,022 members of which 840 are cable subscribers, 128 are individuals, and 54 are organizations. During this quarter, the Foundation tripled its playback hours for Channel 18.

Sacramento Metropolitan Cable Television Commission. Metrocable 28, operated by the Sacramento Metropolitan Cable Television Commission, cablecast an average of 17 hours per week of original community use programming, exceeding our original goal of 4 hours per week. This increase is due primarily to the addition of the weekly Sacramento City Council and monthly Galt Planning Commission meetings. In total, 1,222 video programming hours were cablecast during the third quarter of 1987, 230 hours were new programs never before cablecast in Sacramento. Program highlights included presentation of election forums for the Sacramento City Council, complete coverage of the County budget hearings and computer generated election results.

KXPR. KXPR continued to provide its cable program music service 18 hours per day, seven days per week.

Religious Coalition for Cable Television. No quarterly report was received from the Religious Coalition.

CONSUMER PROTECTION/COMPLAINTS/INQUIRIES

Staff received 599 complaints/inquiries from July 1 through September 30, 1987.



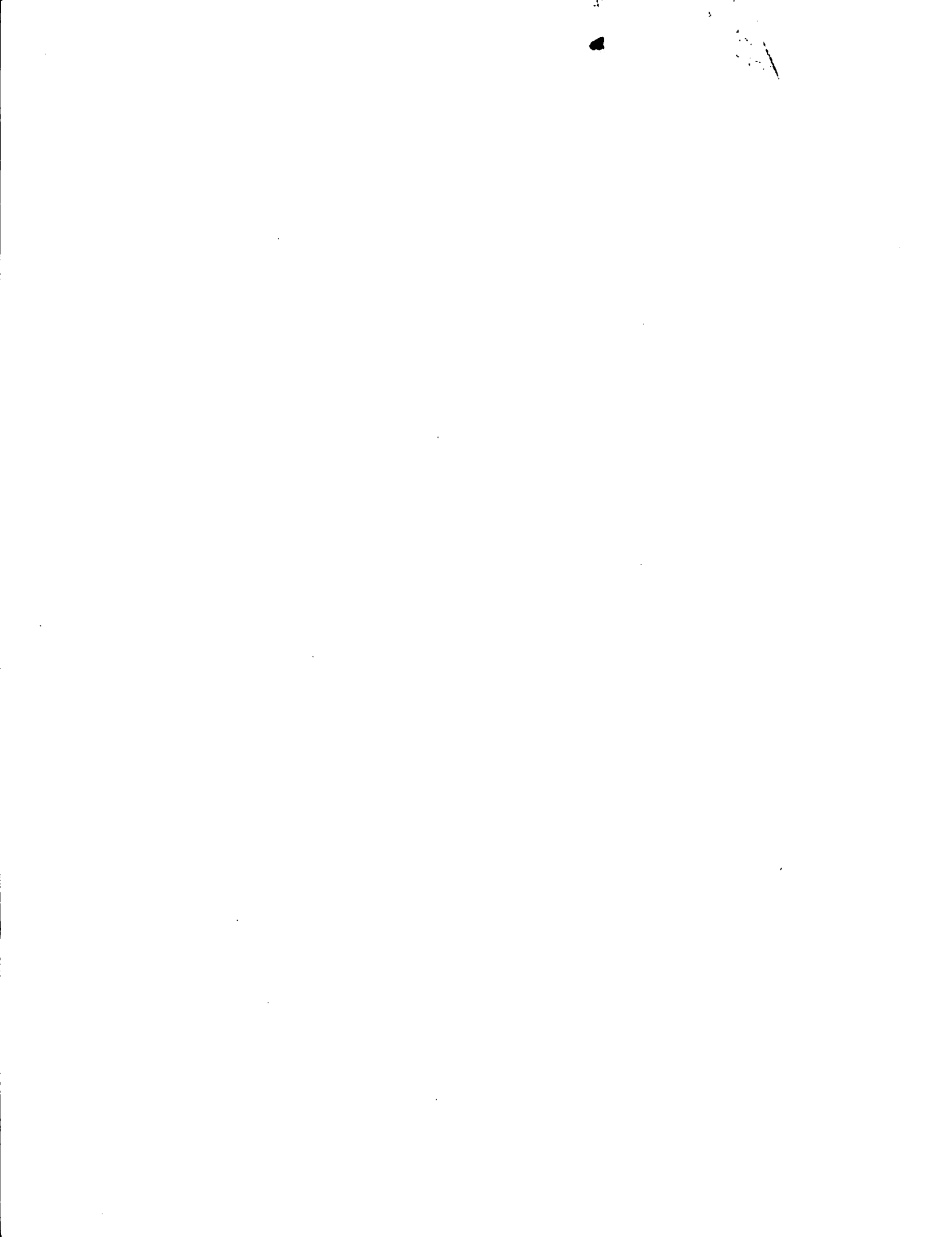
