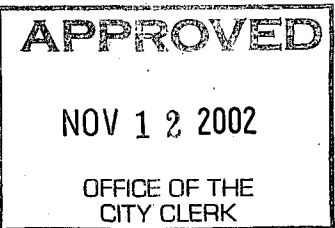

**SUBJECT: REQUEST TO ACCEPT CONTINUATION OF GRANT FUNDING FROM  
THE OFFICE OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE PLANNING FOR THE CRANK  
ROCK IMPACT PROJECT-SACRAMENTO**

**LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:** Citywide

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the City Council authorize the Police Department to continue accepting funding from the State of California's Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OJCP) through assigning three (3) police officers to the Crank Rock Impact Project – Sacramento (CRIPS) until 6-30-03. No cash match is required

*The mission of the Sacramento Police Department is to work in partnership with the Community to protect life and property; solve neighborhood problems, and enhance the quality of life in our City.*

**SUMMARY:**

The Sacramento County Sheriff's Department was awarded funding from 7-1-02 through 6-30-03 for the CRIPS grant from the State of California's Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP). The Police Department's share of this grant is \$311,806. The grant includes a comprehensive, multi-component approach to combating the sale of methamphetamine and rock cocaine by mid-level and major drug dealers. All grant funds expended for the project will be reimbursed by OCJP to the County of Sacramento where the funds will be managed by the County of Sacramento on behalf of the Police Department and the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department, Probation Department and District Attorney's Office. No cash match is required by the City.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Anti-Drug Abuse Enforcement Program established by OCJP is funded by a federal block grant pursuant to repeated amendments to the Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 and most recently in 1994 under the Crime Act. This program was established to aid state and local criminal justice agencies by improving their ability to combat illegal drugs and drug related violence. The theme of the ADA Program is enhanced collaboration and coordination between criminal justice agencies at the local, state, and federal levels.

Funding is allocated annually by county using a base rate and the crime index. The Fiscal Year 2002/2003 funding allocation for Sacramento County is \$1,101,109. The County is the primary grantee with the Sacramento Police Department, Probation Department and District Attorney's Office each acting in a sub-grantee role. The total award will be received and administered by the County of Sacramento for reimbursement of grant-related expenses for the Sheriff's Department, Police Department, Probation Department and District Attorney's Office.

The current grant program has concentrated on mid-level and major drug dealers of methamphetamine and rock cocaine. Because of this highly successful program, significant inroads have been made against Sacramento's drug offenders and dealers. It is anticipated that the program will continue aggressive pursuit of gang-related narcotics traffickers who victimize our citizens by restricting free access to our streets, which contributes to the deterioration of our neighborhoods.

**FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

Funding is allocated annually by OCJP for the Anti-Drug Abuse Enforcement Program. The allocation to continue the CRIPS grant through June 30, 2003 is \$1,101,109. The Police Department's share is \$311,806 that will continue to fund three (3) police officer positions.

Authority to increase the Police Department's Program Budget by \$311,806 for the current Fiscal Year of 2002/2003 is requested. The funding will cover salary, benefits, training and operating costs for the Police Department, Sacramento County Sheriff's Department, Probation Department and District Attorney's Office.


**POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CONTINUATION OF FUNDING FROM THE OFFICE OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE PLANNING FOR THE CRANK ROCK IMPACT-SACRAMENTO GRANT.

WHEREAS the City of Sacramento desires to continue participating in a certain project designated the Crank Rock Impact Project-Sacramento to be funded in part from funds made available through the Crime Act of 1994 for the Federal Anti-Drug Abuse Enforcement Program administered by the State of California's Office of Criminal Justice Planning (hereafter referred to as CRIPS)

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO THAT:

1. The City Manager of the City of Sacramento, or his designated representative, is hereby authorized on behalf of the City of Sacramento, to accept CRIPS grant funds in the amount of \$311,806 including any extensions or amendments thereof.
2. The Program Budget shall be amended as follows:  
255-EFP-E263-3511 State Grant \$311,806

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution covers grant agreements for the period from July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003 including any extensions or amendments thereof.

IT IS AGREED that any liability arising out of the performance of this Grant Award Agreement, including civil court actions for damages, shall be the responsibility of the City of Sacramento and the County of Sacramento. The State of California and OCJP disclaim responsibility for any such liability.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.

IT IS ALSO AGREED that this award is not subject to local hiring freezes.
