RESOLUTION ORDERING WORK No. 1550.

RESOLVED, that the public interest and convenience require, and the City Council of the City of Sacramento hereby orders the following street work to be done in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, known as the "Improvement Act of 1911", approved April 7th, 1911, and the several Acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, to-wit:

Improving the alley between "Y" Street and Burnett Way, in the City of Sacramento, from the east line of 24th Street to the manhole in place in 25th Street, by excavating a trench and constructing therein a vitrified ironstone pipe sewer with seventeen (17) six (6) inch vitrified ironstone wye branches attached, and backfilling the trench.

All of said work shall be done in accordance with plans and specifications adopted for doing said work and now on file in the office of the City Engineer.

That the costs and expenses of said work and improvement shall be chargeable and charged upon the district of lands herein described, which is hereby declared to be the district benefited by said work and improvement, and which is to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof. Said district is bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the southeast corner of 24th and Y Streets; thence to the southwest corner of 25th and Y Streets; thence to the northwest corner of 25th Street and Burnett Way; thence to the northeast corner of 24th Street and Burnett Way; thence to the point of beginning. All as shown on plat of said district approved by the City Council and now on file in the office of the City Engineer.

Saving and excepting from the above bounden and described district the area of the alley included therein.

The Clerk of this Council is hereby directed to post conspicuously for five (5) days on or near the Council Chamber Door of this City Council notice hereof, with specifications, inviting sealed proposals or bids for doing said work; and to publish for two (2) days a notice hereof, inviting sealed proposals or bids for doing said work, and referring to the specifications posted and on file, the said publication to be in the Sacramento Star, a daily newspaper published and circulated in said City of Sacramento and hereby designated for that purpose.

All such proposals or bids shall be received by the Clerk of this Council, at the Council Chamber of this City Council, in the City Hall of said City, on the 22nd day of September, 1921, and up to the hour of 9 o'clock P. M., and said day is hereby designated as the day on which, at the hour of 9 o'clock P. M., the said proposals or bids shall be opened, all of which shall be specified in said notices, and said notices shall require with said proposals or bids a check certified by a responsible bank, payable to the City of Sacramento, for an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the aggregate of the proposal, or by a bond for the said amount, and so payable, signed by the bidder and two sureties, all as prescribed by law.

RESOLUTION ORDERING WORK No. 1552

RESOLVED, that the public interest and convenience require, and the City Council of the City of Sacramento hereby orders the following street work to be done in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, known as the "Improvement Act of 1911" approved April 7th, 1911, and the several Acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, to-wit:

Improving Santa Cruz Way, in the City of Sacramento, from the southerly line of 5th Avenue to the northerly line of 3th Avenue, by removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; constructing concrete curb and gutter on official line and grade where the same does not exist on official line and grade, placing two (2) cast iron gutter drains and connecting same to manhole in place with six (6) inch vitrified ironstone sewer pipe; grading the roadway and constructing thereon an asphaltic concrete pavement five and one-half (5½) inches in thickness.

All of said work shall be done in accordance with plans and specifications adopted for doing said work and now on file in the office of the City Engineer.

Notice is hereby given that serial bonds to represent unpaid assessments and bear interest at the rate of seven (7) per cent. per annum will be issued hereunder in the manner provided by the "Improvement Bond Act of 1915", the last installment of which bonds shall mature nine (9) years from their date.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 1555.

RESOLVED, by the City Council, of the City of Sacramento, that the work hereinafter mentioned is of more than local and ordinary public benefit, and that the public interest and convenience require that said work be done, and that it is the intention of the said City Council to order to be done in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, known as the "Improvement Act of 1911" approved April 7th, 1911, and the several Acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto to-wit:-

Improving 5th Street in the City of Sacramento, from the southerly line of "Q" Street to the northerly line of "S" Street, except that portion required by law to be kept in order and repair by any company or persons having railroad tracks thereon, by removing and disposing of all refuse and surplus material, constructing concrete curbwall, constructing concrete curbs and gutters on official line and grade where the same do not exist on official line and grade; placing cast iron gutter drains and connecting same to sewer with six (6) inch vitrified ironstone sewer pipe; grading the roadway and constructing thereon an asphaltic concrete pavement six (6) inches in thickness.

All of said work shall be done in accordance with plans specifications adopted for doing said work and now on file in the office of the City Engineer.

An Ordinance requiring physicians and surgeons, also superintendents, proprietors or other persons in charge of any public or private hospital, sanitarium or drug store within the City of Sacramento, to keep a record of aid or treatment given to, as well as to report to the Chief of Police, any person who has become an inmate or patient of, or who has been brought into such hospital, sanitarium or drug store, for treatment for any wound or other injury; making a violation of this ordinance a misdemeanor and providing a penalty therefor.

RESOLUTION OF AWARD NO. 1539.

RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Sacramento, having in open session on the 8th day of September 1921, opened, examined, and publicly declared all sealed proposals or bids offered for the following street work to be done in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, known as the "Improvement Act of 1911", approved April 7th, 1911, and the several Acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, to-wit:

Improving the alley between 12th and 13th Avenues, in the City of Sacramento, from the sewer in place in 44th Street to the center line of 47th Street by excavating a trench and constructing therein an eight (8) inch vitrified ironstone pipe sewer with forty-two (42) six (6) inch vitrified ironstone wye branches attached, constructing three (3) concrete manholes complete with cast iron curbs and covers, and backfilling the trench.

All of said work shall be done in accordance with plans and specifications adopted for doing said work and now on file in the office of the Superintendent of Streets.

That the costs and expenses of said work and improvement shall be chargeable and charged upon the district of lands herein described, which is hereby declared to be the district affected and benefited by said work and improvement, and which is to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof. Said district is bounded and described as follows:

On the north by the south line of 12th Avenue, on the east by the west line of 47th Street, on the south by the north line of 13th Avenue, and on the west by the east line of 44th Street. All as shown on map of said district approved by the City Commission and now on file in the office of the City Engineer.

Saving and excepting from the above bounden and described district the area of the streets and alley included therein.

Hereby rejects all of said bids except that next hereinafter mentioned, and hereby awards the Contract for said work to the lowest regular responsible bidder, to-wit:

To J. W. Terrell at the prices specified in his proposal on file for said work.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to Advertise this Resolution and Notice of Adoption hereof in the Sacramento Star a daily newspaper published and circulated in this city for a period of two days, as required by law and to post the same conspicuously for a period of five days on the Bulletin Board near the door of the Council Chamber of the City Council as required by law.

An Ordinance specifying the powers and duties of the Building Inspector of the City of Sacramento; providing by whom the destruction, reconstruction, construction and alteration of certain buildings shall be supervised; prohibiting any person, firm or corporation from erecting any building or structure, or adding to or extending any building or structure already erected in the City of Sacramento without first obtaining a permit from the City Controller; fixing the fees to be collect-

110 for said permits; fixing a penalty for the violation of the provisions of this Ordinance; repealing Ordinance No. 208, passed April 10th, 1905, approved April 12th, 1905, and repealing Ordinance No. 302, Third Series, passed July 15th, 1919.

ORDINANCE NO. _____ FOURTH SERIES.

An Ordinance providing for the granting of Certificates of Registration to, and licensing of electrical contractors and for the suspension and revocation thereof; providing for the granting of permits for electrical work and when such permits shall become void; providing for inspections of electrical work and establishing the fees to be paid for such inspections; providing the mode of payment of such fees, and the penalty of nonpayment; providing for the time and conditions of granting a Certificate of Final Inspection of electrical work and prohibiting the covering of electrical work or the connecting of electrical work or the connecting of electrical current thereto until the receipt of such Certificate of Final Inspection; establishing a standard, rules and regulations for electrical work in, on or about buildings in the City of Sacramento; partially exempting electrical construction for certain purposes from said standard, rules and regulations; providing for the inspection of buildings and other structures to ascertain whether electrical work therein, thereon, and thereabout conforms to said standard, rules and regulations, and providing a procedure when it is found to so conform; providing that this Ordinance shall not be construed to lessen the responsibility of any person, firm or corporation for damages or any defect in electrical work owned, operated or installed thereby, because of any inspection thereof made by the City or any Certificate of Inspection granted by the City Electrician, and providing a penalty for the violation or failure to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance; and repealing Ordinance No. 272 - 3rd Series, passed March 20th, 1917.

An ordinance designating the officers, members and attaches of the Health Department, defining their duties and fixing their compensation; designating the Divisions of which said Department shall consist and declaring the jurisdiction of each Division; fixing the amount of fees to be charged by the Plumbing Inspection Division for permits and inspections; requiring Physicians and Midwives to make certain returns to the Health Officer each month and requiring parents in the absence of attendants, to make a report of births to the Health Officer, making a violation of the provisions of this ordinance a misdemeanor and prescribing a penalty therefor; repealing Ordinance No. 452, Third Series, passed March 6th, 1917, repealing Ordinance No. 452, Third Series, passed Febru-

ary 3th, 1921; and making this Ordinance an Emergency Measure to take effect immediately.
