SUBJECT: Street Light Painting Project

SUMMARY

This is an information report to provide the City Council with an overview of what will be undertaken for the first year of this six year program.

BACKGROUND

On August 4, 1987, the City Council authorized the City Manager to enter into an agreement with the Sacramento Local Conservation Corps (SLCC) for painting of City owned street light poles.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

SLCC began the project on September 21, 1987, with a crew of two persons, in the Curtis Park area. This area was selected as the starting point because of its close proximity to the 24th Street Corporation Yard for ease of monitoring the work process and quality by the City's senior painter.

For the first phase of this project, we will be concentrating on painting neighborhood light standards (under 10 feet in height) that are in most need in each Council District, (see attached schedule). Signalized intersections and standards over 10 feet in height will be picked up in about the second phase of this project. This determination was made based on the following factors:

1. SLCC does not have any high lift equipment to handle standards above 10 feet height. City will have to provide funding for leasing the required equipment;
2. Intersections pose a hazard and need to be coned off for safety of crew. Crews will have to be trained on how to do this properly; and
3. First year the program will enable the City to monitor the capability of SLCC crews and quality of work.

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Once the entire project has been completed, then it is planned to establish a program to paint the light standards on a five (5) to seven (7) year cycle, working the City from North to South.


FINANCIAL DATA

Funding for this project is provided for FY1987-88. Appropriations for continuing this project will have to be provided in the operational budget annually.


