SUBJECT: Swimming Pool Agreement - Sacramento Job Corps Center

SUMMARY

This report recommends that the City enter into an agreement with Sacramento Job Corps Center for the use of their swimming pool during the 1984 summer season.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The City has conducted a recreational swim program at the Sacramento Job Corps Center and has had an agreement with the Center since 1979. The service is an essential part of this Department's summer program.

The Department of Parks and Community Services wishes to enter into an agreement for the 1984 summer season for use of the Center's swimming pool. This agreement allows the City to utilize the facility for recreational purposes to the benefit of the public. Significant terms of the agreement include:

1. Schedule of use.
2. One-year agreement.
3. City appoints and pays for personnel.
4. City is entitled to retain entrance fees to the pool.
5. Agreement may be terminated upon ten (10) days written notice by either party.


FINANCIAL DATA

RECOMMENDATION


