Services will be 2 p.m. Sunday for Edwin W. Wismer, founder and co-owner of Wismer and Becker electrical contractors, a large firm which built power plants worldwide.

Mr. Wismer died Thursday (Feb. 3). He was 81.

A native of San Francisco, Mr. Wismer moved to the Sacramento area in 1934 and founded his company 13 years later.

Active in civic and professional affairs, Mr. Wismer was a member of the Natoma Lodge No. 64 F&AM, Scottish Rite Bodies, Ben Ali Temple of the Shrine, Jester Court 119, Sutter Club, Del Paso Country Club, Grandfathers Club of America No. 1 and Fremont Presbyterian Church.

Mr. Wismer also served or had been a member of many other organizations, including the Sacramento Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce, U.S. Chamber of Commerce, International Society of Electrical Engineers and the Building Construction Board of Appeals of Sacramento County. He also had served as senior electrical engineer for the state Division of Architect-
